July 22, 2018 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 6:30-34

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

Peace! We see a homecoming in the gospel today. Jesus had sent out the apostles last week, and today they return to home base and enjoy time catching up with Jesus. He wants them to share with Him the adventures and experiences they had on their mission (just like he wants to spend time with us each day in prayer; Do we give Him the time?) I find details in the reading that tell me Jesus sent them out pretty far on mission. Why? Remember even though he said not to take an extra bag or money along, He did say take a walking stick and sandals. They were going to be walking a while. Maybe it was so far out that they even wore out their shoes! This reminds me of what Pope Francis said in a homily back in January to Bishops in Peru. He mentioned the example of St Turibius Mogrovejo, saying, "Today we would call Turibius a "street" bishop. A bishop with shoes worn out by walking, by constant travel, by setting out to "preach the Gospel to all: to all places, on all occasions, without hesitation. The joy of the Gospel is for all people: no one can be excluded" (1-21-2018). Like the apostles and St Turibius, Pope Francis himself carries the gospel far and wide on mission. I love about Pope Francis that back in July 2013 as his first trip out of Rome, he traveled to the island of Lampedusa Italy, which was a sanctuary spot for migrants fleeing war and persecution in Africa. Many migrants died in the water trying to get to safety. He went to offer mass for the dead and pray with the survivors. He was going the distance to uphold the dignity of the migrants as fellow human beings in need of compassionate treatment. (Another humble and humorous detail about Francis and that trip is that he personally called the Airline Alitalia Customer Desk himself to book his flight, and they in turn called Vatican Security to inquire about the man claiming to be Pope wanting a plane ticket!) But Pope Francis is not afraid of reaching out in missionary work, walking and following in the footsteps of Jesus, wherever He leads!

But, everyone needs sanctuary, too. We call it prayer. Jesus calls each of us to escape the grind of work and worry to be rejuvenated. In today's gospel, Jesus invites us to 'Come away with me' (and we thought Norah Jones sang that first! No, it was Jesus!). Jesus sets the example. He shows our need to go to work on missions, and the equal necessity to take time to unwind in His presence. We call that 'Sabbath time': the need to rest with God. We give six days to working and toiling, and we take a seventh day as a time of enjoyment and refreshment. Hebrews 4:10 "whoever enters into God's rest, rests from his own works as God did from His." We seek God's rest. Yet, we have to allow the time. We need to give God some morning or evening time for daily prayer, so He can give us the peace & purpose we seek. (We Catholics are blessed with daily mass opportunities. Consider adding daily mass as a spiritual break in the week!)
