Pueblo, Colorado, October 12– The Orchard of Hope Foundation in Pueblo announces that it has funded five local cancer patients, and four additional patients will be funded next week. Money has been raised through the fundraisers Gourmet Sampler and Walk For Hope and through general donations. Spradley Auto Network donated \$100 for each car sold on Oct. 6 and 7 (the day of the Walk For Hope) for a total of \$2,200. Also, the David and Lucile Packard Foundation has recently given a grant to the Orchard of Hope Foundation. Cancer patients who live in Pueblo County and who are currently in treatment are invited to submit an application for assistance. Sweetened whipped cream, for garnish (optional)

2 ounces grated white chocolate, for garnish (optional)

2 ounces grated bittersweet chocolate, for garnish (optional)

1. Prepare chocolate cookie crust: In a large bowl, combine cookie crumbs, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, coffee powder, butter and almonds and stir to blend. Spoon into a 12-inch springform pan. Pat crumbs firmly onto bottom and press them 3/4-inch up the sides. Cover and freeze overnight.

2. Prepare filling: In a large bowl, place softened vanilla and chocolate ice creams; swirl together briefly to marble. Stir in nuts and liqueur, if used. Spoon into chocolate cookie crust and return to freezer. Freeze until solid (at least 2 hours).

3. Just before serving, garnish with sweetened whipped cream, white chocolate and bittersweet chocolate, if
