
AMNETS Ladies Auxiliary Department of New York Annual Basket Raffle at June Convention June 8-10, 2023

I would like to thank the 15 Auxiliaries that sent in a Mid-year Service Report for Child Welfare. Together we had 101 ladies that donated 671 hours, completing 27 projects, giving us a total evaluation of \$24,714. We also had 2 Auxiliaries that reported having 13 youth volunteers participating in 2 projects for a total evaluation of \$1,343.

**The definition of a Child Welfare project is "an activity that benefits CHILDREN ONLY".

In keeping with my theme "the future of the world is in a classroom", this year the topic for the Child Welfare Chairman's Award is ADOPT A CLASS with the award going to the Auxiliary that has THE MOST INNOVATIVE PROJECT TO BENEFIT A CLASSROOM. Keep in mind to be eligible for this award, an entry form must be filled out & sent to me by the deadline on the form. (this form will be in the Honors and Awards packet).

Also, remember there is a contest available for our children titled AMVETS Against Drug & Alcohol Abuse or the AADAA program. Information and the entry forms for this contest can be found on the AMVETS National website. The local winners need to be sent to me by 6/1/23 for the Department to judge, with the Dept. winners being sent on to National.

In keeping with my theme, THE FUTURE OF THE WORLD IS IN A CLASSROOM, the topic for my Chairman's Award is "ADOPT A CLASS" with the award going to the Auxiliary that has the MOST INNOVATIVE PROJECT TO BENEFIT A CLASSROOM. Remember you must apply for this award separately by filling out & sending me the entry form that can be found on page 13 in the Honors & Awards package by May 1st.

If any children participated in the AADAA program this year, the winners from your local Auxiliary need to be sent to me by June 1st. They will then be judged by the Dept. Drug & Alcohol Abuse Chairmen & sent on to National.

Spring SEC Report

I want to start off by expressing my heartfelt gratitude for all the donations for Broome County CHOW. The donations from the AMVETS, Sons, Riders, and our local Auxiliaries have been very generous and will greatly impact this community in great need of support. If your Auxiliary participated, please be sure to include your work on your Community Service Reports for this year.

I wanted to take a moment to reflect on work already reported. Seventeen (17) Auxiliaries sent in midyear reports for Community Service. There were 112 projects with 172 volunteers contributing 4,433 hours. The total mid-year evaluation was \$203,380. In addition, four (4) Auxiliaries sent in Youth Community Service Reports with 10 projects, 14 volunteers, 84 hours, and a total youth evaluation of \$1,774. I eagerly await end of year reports to add to these totals.

Please make sure that three (3) copies of Community Service Reports are postmarked by April 25, 2023. The year-long report should also include the projects from the mid-year. Please round all dollar amounts to the whole dollar (there should be no cents in your reports) and check all the math. Do not forget to include any volunteer hours, projects, or donations made to PAWS With A Cause®, our National Community Service Project. All donations for PAWS With A Cause® should be made to the **Department** by May 1st. I also encourage each Auxiliary to have their reports reviewed and signed by the local President before submitting and please be sure to keep a copy of your report for your records. If there is an issue, it makes it much easier if we both have a copy to work through over the phone or computer.

As another reminder, my Chairman's Award this year will be given to the **Auxiliary that has the most creative project benefiting a local food bank or food pantry**. You must apply for this award! Applications can be found in the Honors and Awards packet but please reach out to me if you need a copy of the application.

Greetings All Local Hospital Officers:

I hope everyone enjoyed their holidays and that your Auxiliary is off to a good start & finds you working on your Hospital Projects. Projects should include any activity that benefits a VA Hospital, local Hospital, or medically staffed nursing home.

I am happy to report that we had 16 Auxiliaries sent in a mid-year report for Hospital. There were 26 projects, 55 volunteers with 485 hours for a total evaluation of \$15,825. These totals are down from prior years but that is due to the restriction placed on the Auxiliaries due to Covid. I am confident that we can bring these numbers up since some if not all restrictions have been lifted in New York. Please make sure to report all your great work and hours that you have been doing.

Reminders for Year-end Reports:

3 copies need to be sent to me (Debbie Stondell, 6 Storm Drive, Holtsville, NY 11742) Postmarked no later than April 25th to be counted in our totals.

Remember to include the totals from your mid-year report in your Annual report. Also, please remember to round all totals to the nearest dollar.

A mid-year report had to be sent in to be eligible to qualify for an award at convention, however, this does not mean that you should not send in a end of year Report. All Hospital projects should be reported & included in our Annual totals

Remember, you need to apply for the Chairmans Award.

Dear AMVETS Ladies Auxiliary Sisters:

As you know, Parliamentary Procedure is a code of rules and ethics for working together. Parliamentary law refers to the rules, law of regulations, having an orderly local meeting, SEC and conventions. Without rules, there would be injustice and confusion.

Basic Principles are as follows:

- 1.) All members have equal rights, privileges and obligations. Majority vote must be carried out and the right of the minority must be preserved.
- 2.) A Quorum must be present for the auxiliary to act. Do not go the bar to get signatures for your quorum. The member must be attending your meeting. And of course, no drinking!
- 3.) Full and free discussion of every motion is a basic right.
- 4.) Only one question at a time can be considered. Do not interrupt the member speaking.
- 5.) The chair must be strictly neutral.

When you follow the Parliamentary Procedure, you maintain order in a meeting and you know your meeting will end on time. Meetings without formalized procedures can extend well beyond a reasonable time frame, often without important questions being resolved or necessary work getting accomplished.

Auxiliaries that are due to review and update their Bylaws are Auxiliary 14, 38, 48, 72, 245, 726, 1013, 1997 and 6472. It is necessary to send 3 copies. I have received Auxiliaries 48 and 245.

If there is something you need clarified seek out your Department Officers – do NOT go directly to a National Officer because they will only direct you back to your Local or Department.

Personality issues do not go directly to Department. The first line of communication is at the Local level.

NEC President did get clarification on the issue of cash register receipts being turned into schools for reimbursement. This is a local situation and depends on the store involved – not an all over source. There was general discussion about valuing of the plastic crocheted mats made for the homeless. No amount was reached. We also had discussion on what constitutes a project and the many parts of a project, what can be used on reports and what was all inclusive – trips to the store, presentations, wrapping, baking, phone calls – a lot of what we talk about in our trainings.

I felt really good about New York because some of the issues brought up we have successfully moved through. Especially important to me was the trainings we now require of our Auxiliaries. This may not sound important, yet when you look at the number of new (and younger) members we are getting there needs to be a good example set for them. And training. We need the "young blood" and we are responsible for making sure they are trained properly and know where to go to find answers! THE MANUAL—and Department Officers. As well as long-time Local members who take their roles seriously.

I was very pleased to have had the opportunity to represent the wonderful Department of New York at the Spring NEC meeting. Thank you for this experience.
