Readings for May 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023

## **First Reading**

Everyone was filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak.

### Reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles (2, 1-11)

On the day of Pentecost, all the disciples were gathered together in one place. Suddenly there was a great noise coming from the sky, as when a strong wind blows, which resonated throughout the house where they were. Then there appeared tongues of fire, and they spread out and settled on them; they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit induced them to express themselves." In those days there were devout Jews in Jerusalem, coming from all over the world. Upon hearing the noise, they flocked and were bewildered, because each heard them speak in their own language. Stunned and full of admiration, they asked, "Aren't they Galileans, all these who are speaking? How, then, do we hear them speak in our native language? Among us are Medes, Parthians and Elamites; others live in Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt or in the area of Libya bordering Cyrene. Some of us are visitors, from Rome, Jews and proselytes; there are also Cretans and Arabs. And yet everyone hears them speak of the wonders of God in their own language." Word of God. # Reading from the Letter of the Apostle Paul to the Ephesians (12, 3-7. 12-13)

Brothers and sisters, no one can call Jesus "Lord," except under the action of the Holy Spirit. There are different gifts, but the Spirit is the same. There are different services, but the Lord is the same. There are different activities, but God, who does everything in everyone, is the same. In each one the Spirit is manifested for the common good. For just as the body is one and has many members and all of them, despite being many, form one body, so is Christ. For all of us, whether Jewish or non-Jewish, slave or free, have been baptized into one Spirit to form one body, and we have all been made to drink of the same Spirit. **Word of God.** *We praise you, Lord.*

Reading of the Holy Gospel according to Saint John (20, 19-23)
