**Supplemental Food for Seniors-**The Kansas Food Bank will start providing CSFP food boxes for low income seniors in Saline County. EAFB is proud to partner with the Kansas Food Bank on this program. For more information call 316-265-3663, ask for DEBI. Appointments will be scheduled for Wednesday, January 24th at EAFB. Food packages include a variety of foods, such as nonfat dry and ultra high temperature fluid milk, juice, farina, oats, ready-to-eat cereal, rice, pasta, peanut butter, dry beans, canned meat, poultry or fish, and canned fruits and vegetables.
