Of course, if your WI is an old hand at virtual meetings and have an event that you would like to throw open to a few wanderers, then please do let us know.




STEEL SISTERS WI

RECIPE CORNER

Yorkshire WI Recipe Book

This months recipe was sent into the Yorkshire WI recipe book by Long Riston WI. They meet in the village hall and were started in 1921. They are an active WI and enjoy entering their own competitions, crafts and days out. Long Riston is just north of Hull and North East of Beverlev.

Cherry Loaf

Ingredients:

5 oz Margarine or butter

5 oz Sugar

2 Eggs

4 oz Glace cherries

1/2 level teaspoon baking powder

Milk to mix 8 oz Plain flour

A little sugar to sprinkle on the top and a few cut cherries

Cream the butter and sugar and add the well beaten eggs. Cream well, then mix in the flour and baking powder stirring in a little milk. Put mixture into a greased loaf tin and sprinkle on cut cherries and sugar. Bake in moderate oven Regulo 3 to 4 or 350F to 375F for one and half hours.

(Please remember these recipes were pre 1983 so measurements and temperatures are old school.)
