Coreopsis tripteris

This native perennial is an important nectar plant for butterflies and insects.

Several species of moth utilize this plant as a host.

The seeds will be eaten by Sparrows, Towhees, Doves and other birds. Coreopsis is also known to be deer resistant.

- Hardiness: Zone 3-8
- Size: 2-8'. Self-seeds
- Flower: Bright yellow flowers from July to September
- Culture: Prefers full sun and well drained soils. Grows well in poor, rocky soils.
- Uses: Perennial border, naturalizing, massing, cut flower, songbirds, butterflies, pollinators, birds, insects, deer and drought tolerant
