


## Congratulations to the Stultz Family!

## What Can We Do to Help?

On Sunday, January 21, a **Family Promise** 

presentation was given by leff Whilhite during the Sunday School hour. Family Promise is a program that provides not only overnight housing to homeless families with children, but also provides support for them to get back into a home again. This program strives to keep families TOGETHER. Family Promise also provides services for their pets until the family is settled in a new residence.

Overnight housing is provided on a rotated schedule by host and support congregations throughout Summit County helping approximately 28-35 families per year. They usually serve four (4) families at a time, who are brought to a host church on Sunday. Each family is supplied with sleeping essentials for the week: beds, sheets, towels, pillows. Beds are set up in rooms for each family, as well as beds for the two hosts from the church who spend the night.

The dinner meal is provided by the host, Sunday through Saturday. Breakfast (grab 'n go items, cereal, toast, etc.) and a packed lunch are prepared by the family each day.

A 15-person van is

provided by Family Promise for a volunteer driver to take the children to school and the adults to the Family Promise Center to meet with their case worker, look for work and learn new ways of problem-solving during the day. They then return for dinner and overnight stay.

As a host participant, St. Stephen would be on a 13-week rotation (quarterly) which would not start until late summer or fall.




people and families with great need. To all who assisted in any way, you made a difference. Thank you.

### St. Stephen Lutheran Church Council Meeting Tuesday, April 10, 2018

#### **PRESENT:**

Pastor John Corsi

Mike Yaquinto - Chairman

#### **OPENING:**

Mike Yaquinto opened the meeting with a word of prayer.

#### **ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES:**

The minutes from the March Council meeting were approved as submitted. Scott Schlea motioned to approve the minutes and Gary Reynolds seconded. Motion passed.

#### **FINANCIAL REPORTS:**

Scott Schlea presented and reviewed the March financial reports. March's total income was \$26,845 and total disbursements were \$35,179. Our year-to-date income is \$59,375 and year-to-date expenses are \$73,584. As of March 6, our mortgage principal balance was \$622,634.38. Scott noted that giving is down roughly \$11,000 for the first quarter. Michelle Amato motioned to approve the reports as received and Sandee Davis seconded. Motion carried.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT:**

Pastor John sent his Pastor's Report electronically for our review prior to Council, which included pastoral acts, worship, visitations, consultations, meetings/activities, trips and other. Pastor mentioned we received a check for \$152 from Indian Trail Elementary School. The students raised the money for Lydia's boxes.

Family Promise Update – Carol Yaquinto will be handing out volunteer packets to those who would like to participate and help with this program. Our first host week begins Sunday, June 17.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Task Force – Final projects from Phase I are almost complete. A few remaining projects include a fence around the condensing units in front of the lounge, signage throughout the building and the repair of the columns outside the main entrance. Council also recommended the purchase of some technology upgrades. Mike accepted a motion from Scott Schlea to approve the purchase of the technology upgrades and Michelle Amato seconded. The motion passed. Council expressed their gratitude to the outgoing Task Force for their time and efforts in upgrading and renovating our building. Our loan with the Mission Investment Fund will close on May 9 and our first mortgage payment will be due June 1. While the original loan request was for \$150,000, which included some cushion for unexpected costs with our roof and other projects, we only used \$115,000.

Financial Secretary – Dani Schlea has agreed to take over Kelly Swindler's position. Council is appreciative of Kelly's hard work and dedication while in this position.

Custodial - Clean Pro will begin custodial services on April 17.

Council Term Expirations – Kim Clark and Scott Schlea will be completing two two-year terms the end of May and are no longer eligible to remain on Council. Michelle Amato will be completing her first term the end of May and has agreed to a second term, if approved. Mike Yaquinto will be finishing the partial term he agreed to when asked to replace a vacant Council position. A few members of our congregation have also expressed interest in being on Council.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Finance Committee – Per the constitution, St. Stephen is required to have a Finance Committee. The Committee must consist of a minimum of three members including a Treasurer, currently Jane Hecht, a Financial Secretary, Dani Schlea will be replacing Kelly Swindler, and a Banker, currently Anjalee Wagers. The positions are not elected by Council, but they report to Council. This committee is responsible for the stewardship of our money, including making financial decisions and preparing a draft budget for Council's review, approval and presentation to the congregation. Mike accepted a motion from Scott Schlea to follow the constitutional guidelines and form a Finance Committee and Sandee Davis seconded it. Motion passed. Council will make sure the committee is staffed with members that have a financial background.

May Congregational Meeting – Joan Conaway will review the completed Task Force projects and costs, the congregation will elect new Council members and Mike Yaquinto will do a year in review for St. Stephen.

Mike Yaquinto accepted a motion from Don Brooker to adjourn the meeting and Scott Schlea seconded. Motion passed. Pastor John closed with prayer. The next Council meeting will be May 8. Council adjourned.

## **Endowment Fund Update**



At the quarterly meeting of the **Endowment Committee** on April 24, Nancy Brown was elected to fill the vacancy created by a resignation. Nancy will complete the remainder of the term that ends on June 30, 2019. Also, Chris Cheline has been elected to a second term and will continue as the committee's Financial Director.

Other members of the committee are Chris Collins (Chair), Cathy Reynolds (Secretary) and Alex Gress.

As of March 31, the value of the Endowment Fund was \$269,469.87 and it had decreased 1.62% since the previous quarter. However, the fund's value increased 11.07% for calendar year 2017.

At the meeting, the committee also endorsed a \$2,000 grant from the Endowment Fund to help with the startup of the Family Promise program. Council will consider final approval of this request.
