


After School Enrichment

The Office of Curriculum and Instruction is currently beginning the GATE screening and identification process for the 2016-2017 school year. This school year OUSD will facilitate universal screening of all 3rd grade students for the GATE Program. Parents who do not want their child tested may fill out an option out form, which can be obtained from the classroom teacher or the GATE office. Students in second grade and 4th-6th grade may be referred for GATE testing by parents or teachers. Screening will take place in January and February of 2017. Identification results will be mailed home by mid-April, 2016.

Identification for GATE involves a review of multiple criteria including

- SAI score on the district selected cognitive abilities test
- Student achievement records
- Lexile/Quantile scores
- Student Profile of Gifted Characteristics filled out by classroom teacher

Parents have the option for students that qualify for GATE Identification to have them attend the assigned GATE magnet school or to remain at their home schools and receive enrichment in the regular classroom. Please note that students qualifying in grades 5 and 6 are often waitlisted for magnet programs.

If a parent wishes to refer a student for consideration, please submit a Referral form online, which can be found on the OUSD GATE website, <u>www.orangeusd.org/gate</u> or contact the GATE office at 714-628-5451. All parent referrals must be submitted to the GATE office no later than December 2, 2016.
