5. Candidate's knowledge of the Greek-American society in Illinois, nationwide, and in Greece
6. Candidate's ability to understand the current socio-economic issues affecting the American people.

PROPOSED TAX AMENDMENT
Proposed Amendment to the 1970 Illinois Constitution Explanation of Amendment as presented on the ballot
<p>The proposed amendment grants the State authority to impose higher income tax rates on higher income levels, which is how the federal government and a majority of other states do it. The amendment would remove the portion of the Revenue Article of the Illinois Constitution that is sometimes referred to as the “flat tax,” that requires all taxes on income to be at the same rate. The amendment does not itself change tax rates. It gives the State the ability to impose higher tax rates on those with higher income levels and lower tax rates on those with middle or lower income levels. You are asked to decide whether the proposed amendment should become a part of the Illinois Constitution.</p>
