## What Do Growing Churches Do?

I will admit it right up front- I am a geek. I geek out about ALL sorts of things. But one of the things I geek out about is church growth. I am passionate about it. AND...I read a lot about it. And I read an article on church growth I want to share with you. Written by Brian K. Dodd, the article focuses on what growing churches do. Dodd has a list-

- 1. Growing churches focus on church health more than church growth.
- 2. Growing churches demand excellence.
- 3. Growing churches are vigilant about their mission, vision and core values.
- 4. Growing churches are willing to stop unproductive ministries.
- 5. Growing churches not only embrace but also foster change.
- 6. Growing churches celebrate.

For my money, that is a fascinating and powerful list. Notice #1- if you want your church to grow, don't focus on growth! Focus on health! That makes good sense to me. And I see us doing that in so many ways. We are not about excluding people. We are not about different "factions" jockeying for position and power. We ARE about welcoming everyone and recognizing that we are all radically equal in the eyes of God.

Then there's #2. Again, I feel we are working really hard on that one. It's important that we refuse to settle for less than excellent- it's what God deserves. No less. We want to always try to make everything we do as good as it can possibly be.

#3 says we have to be vigilant about our mission. Can you name the mission of your church? If you have been coming here more than a few months...I'm nearly positive you can! "We exist to connect people to Jesus Christ". We measure everything we do with that yardstick.

The hardest one of the bunch might be #4. Why? Because that means if we have a ministry that is beloved...but is unproductive and doesn't support our mission...we need to be willing to put that that one to bed. It's HARD to shut down ministries. But it's sometimes essential. And I see us more and more willing to evaluate and reevaluate, measuring which ministries are working and which one are ready to be "put to bed".

#5 probably SEEMS like the hardest...because it has the word "change" in it! (Gasp!) Let's recognize the 400 pound gorilla in the room- change can be hard. But healthy things grow. And when they grow...they change. And if they CAN'T...or WON'T...change, they don't grow. And if they don't grow...they eventually die.

And then there's #6. We like to celebrate, don't we? We celebrate the big things, to be sure. But we also celebrate the small things. (We sing "happy birthday" nearly every Sunday!) We have a lot to celebrate and we should be ready and willing to regularly do just that!

At the end of the article, Dodd says, "While your church may have grown numerically, is Jesus happy with the church that has been built?" That's a VERY good thing to consider. And when I'm honest in regard to that question, I think the answer is "Yes!" I am confident that Jesus is happy with who we are and where we're headed. I also am convinced that He has a LOT more for us to do!

#### Living a Contagious Life


WHAT: Rev. Mark's current Wednesday evening Bible Study

#### **CURRENT SERMON SERIES**

The New Testament story of the Prodigal Son is one of the best known, most scrutinized stories in the Bible. But at its heart...what is the story REALLY about? Who IS the Prodigal? And what does it have to tell us about life in 21<sup>st</sup> Century America?

In January, we began asking all of those questions- and many more- as we started **The Long Journey Home**. Each week, we are focusing on a few verses from the Prodigal Son story- unpacking it to see what is underneath and, more importantly, what it has to say to us. The remaining weeks the series look like this:

Sunday, February 5, 2017- Celebrating (Luke 15:22-24)

Reunited...and it feels so good! (Psalm 150, Philippians 4:4)

Sunday, February 12, 2017- Realizing (Luke 15:25-27)

Sometimes, the truth is hard to hear. (Proverbs 18:2, Colossians 4:6)

**Sunday, February 19, 2017-** <u>Accusing</u> (Luke 15:28-30)

Jealousy often leads to pain. (Isaiah 53:7, Jude 1:3)

Sunday, February 26, 2017- Reconciling (Luke 15:31-32)

Though the sorrow may last for the night, the joy comes in the morning! (Psalm 34:8, Ephesians 4:32) Come each week expecting God to show up in powerful ways!

In January of 2018, Joanne and I will be helping lead a trip to the Holy Land. And WHAT a trip it will be- it will focus on following the path of Jesus' life, from Bethlehem all the way to the Garden Tomb.

We will fly out of St. Louis on Jan. 8, 2018, landing in Tel Aviv on the 9<sup>th</sup>. That night, we will stay in a hotel in Bethlehem. On the 10<sup>th</sup>, we will explore one of the most exciting archeological digs in Israel-the Herodion, the palace fortress and final resting place of Herod the Great. Then it's on to Bethlehem, where we will visit the cave where Jesus was born, the Church of the Nativity and the Shepherds' Field, where angels first proclaimed the Good News.

On the 11<sup>th</sup>, we will visit Tel Megiddo (the Biblical site of Armageddon), Sepphoris (the cosmopolitan Roman capital of Galilee), Nazareth (Jesus' boyhood home) before remembering wedding vows at the Franciscan Wedding in Cana (the site of Jesus' first miracle). On the 12<sup>th</sup>, we will visit the Valley of the Doves, Magdala, Capernaum and the traditional site of the feeding of the 5,000 before having worship on a boat on the Sea of Galilee. We will spend the night in Galilee.

On the 13<sup>th</sup>, it's on to Northern Israel, Tel Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Golan Heights and the Mount of Beatitudes before remembering our baptism at the Jordan River. On the 14<sup>th</sup>, we will tour Beit Shean, Qumran (where the Dead Sea scrolls were found) and the Mount of Olives before going on the Palm Sunday Walk, ending in the Garden of Gethsemane. On the 15<sup>th</sup>, it's into Jerusalem to see the Emek Tzurim (the Temple Sifting Project), the Gihon Spring, Hezekiah's Tunnel, the Pool of Siloam and the Southern Steps of the Temple. We will end the day with a visit to Mt. Zion and stand in the Upper Room.

On the 16<sup>th</sup>, it's on to morning prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane and the Kidron Valley before walking to Via Dolorosa (the path Jesus walked to the cross). We will also visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher and take Communion at the Garden Tomb, where the Resurrection happened. On the 17<sup>th</sup>, we fly back into St. Louis. (continued on page 9)

#### **VALENTINE'S DAY**

Love is an amazing thing. It breaks all the rules. It has a mind of its own. And it cannot be stopped. Think about itthere are people you love, and you can't even begin to explain why...you just do. Likewise, there are people who love you, and sometimes you can't imagine for the life of you why they do. Another truth about love is that it is so much more than simply an emotion. Love is a conscious choice that takes dedication, perseverance, and some good, oldfashioned hard work.

We all know that February 14<sup>th</sup> is Valentine's Day- the day we send cards, flowers, and candy to loved ones. (Hallmark and Hershey's have made several fortunes based on that fact.) This Valentine's Day, I hope you do that again (if it is your habit). But along with the conventions, I have a challenge for you...2 challenges, to be exact.

Your first challenge is to make a list of the people you love the most. Write down the 5 things you love the most about them. And then...TELL THEM! Share with them what you love about them. Leave out ANY negatives (we all have them), and focus on the positive aspects of the person. It will make them feel so good, and, surprise, surprise, it will make you feel good, too!

Your second challenge is to spend a total of 15 minutes every day this month in prayer, letting God know how much you love Him.

You may be saying, "15 minutes?!" I said <u>total</u>. Split it up- 5 minutes at a time. You may be saying, "EVERY day for a MONTH?!" Remember, February is the shortest month of the year! You may be saying, "How much I <u>love</u> God?! Yes, we are called to love God, above all else. God loves us SO much that He sent His only Son to live among us, teach us, die for our sins, and rise for our eternal lives. When you look at it that way, how could we NOT love God? Make sure you tell those around you they are loved. Also, make sure you tell God how much you love Him.

#### CANDLE...WHAT?

On February 2nd, we recognize a little-noticed The glory day in the church calendar- Candlemas. De-of Thy people scribed in the Gospel of Luke (2:22–40), it's the day Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem forty days

after his birth to both complete Mary's required post-childbirth purification and perform the redemption of the firstborn.

When they arrived at the temple, they met Simeon, who had been promised by God that "he should not see death before he had seen the Messiah of the Lord." He took Jesus in his arms and prayed the prayer that would become known as the Canticle of Simeon, which prophesied the redemption of the world by Jesus. This was baby Jesus' introduction to God's house, as well as the church's 1st "formal" meeting with the Messiah.

God chose to come down in the form of a newborn- that fact never ceases to amaze! Churches often talk about "Christmas and Easter People" (those who only come to church on special holidays), but we ARE Christmas and Easter people. We worship a God Who chose to do the miraculous- a birth in a manger and a death on a cross-FOR us, so that we might be redeemed. We should keep the miracle of those seasons in our hearts all year long.
