Shrove Tuesday is the day before Lent, which starts on Ash Wednesday. The name Shrove comes from the old middle English word 'Shriven' meaning resolve. During Lent, Christians enter into a more intense time of prayer, fasting, reflection, and self-examination.

The custom of eating pancakes on Shrove Tuesday comes from the old English custom of using up all the rich ingredients in the house before Lent, so that people were ready to fast during Lent. These rich ingredients that most people had in their houses in those days were eggs and milk. A very simple recipe to use up these ingredients was to combine them with some flour and make pancakes!

Even if you're not planning on ridding your house of eggs and milk during Lent, come and enjoy some great fellowship with us, all while supporting our Red Bird Mission Trip.

## From the Pastor's Desk

40 Day of Lent: Find Your Own Path

As we prepare to begin the season of Lent, Christ is inviting us to observe a Holy Lent through self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and through reading and meditating on the Holy Word. However, there is no one prescribed way. Instead, we are each encouraged to find our own method of confronting our own sinfulness, remembering our mortality, and giving thanks for the gift of salvation we receive through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Fasting. One of the more common practices is to enter into a time of fasting. We fast to reorient ourselves away from the distraction of material pleasures, and back toward God. There are many ways to fast. You might choose to fast one meal per day,or one day per week, or you may choose to fast from a particular pleasure during the entire season of Lent. (For example, if you abstain from sugar, meat, dairy, or a similar luxury item during Lent, Sundays are typically exempted, so you can treat yourselves to those items on Sundays.) There is a practice of fasting from non-food items like social media and such, which is great. However, John Wesley was clear that no matter what else you fast from, it is absolutely essential to fast to food. Read "When You Fast" - a sermon by John Wesley, available through a Google search.

Another way to fast is to do the Wesley Fast . The Wesley Fast is every Wednesday and Friday, where we fast from sunup until "tea time," which is right around 3pm.

If you didn't do the Daniel Fast during the first three weeks of January, you might choose to do the Daniel Fast during Lent. Guidelines and recipe books are available upon request.

Another way to reorient your life toward God, is to focus on devotional practices like Bible study and prayer during the season. Many do not know where to begin when reading the Bible. Devotional books can help give you a focus. Check out our library or ask Pastor Kris for recommendations and loaner books. Devotional books typically have a daily reading, scripture passage, and a thought provoking commentary to help you go deeper in your faith.

#### **Prayer**

In the busyness of our everyday lives, prayer can sometimes get squeezed out. Lent is a wonderful time to intentionally work toward finding more time in your life for prayer. You can experiment with different ways to pray during the season, or really delve into a new-to-you way of praying. Enriching your prayer life is a great way to spend Lent.

#### Service

Another way to observe a holy Lent is to take on a new way of serving. Throughout the forty days of the season you can adopt a new habit of volunteering in the community, making special financial gifts to service organizations, singing in the choir, or participating in a small group.

#### Rest

An important practice with which many of us struggle is the spiritual discipline of rest or Sabbath. In addition to recognizing Sunday as a day of rest, you can also find moments during an ordinary day to be still in God's presence. You might choose to spend a few minutes during lunch with a desktop meditation, listen to sermons on your commute, or read a poem that feeds your spirit. Each can be a great way of enriching your faith. Prepare now and be ready for an EPIC Lent!



# ITALY - and the Oberamergau, Germany PASSION PLAY - August 2020

Do you like to travel? Pastor Kris & Mike are leading a trip in August 2020 through the tour company Educational Opportunities. This is the same organization that we went to the Holy Lands with in 2012, and we were very impressed with this company. This trip will feature:

- \*The Passion Play in Oberamergau, Germany (the longest running passion play, put on every 10 years since 1634.)
- \*Innsbruck, Austria
- \*Venice
- \*Florence, including Basilica of St. Mark and the Academy, which features many of Michaelangelo's works of art.
- \*Assisi, where a large basilica was built in honor of St. Francis
- \*Rome, St. Paul Outside the Walls, and the Catacombs
- \*Vatican Museums, the Sistine Chapel, St. Peter's Basilica, and the Pantheon
- \*Ancient Rome, including the Coliseum

The trip is approximately \$4,990/ per person which includes airfare from Newark, NJ, hotels, breakfast and dinner, and all tours. Not included is transportation to Newark, lunches, and a ticket to the Passion Play, which is \$200 per person. Contact Pastor Kris with questions.
