

How to join the Garden Club of DeLand

Please read the descriptions of the Circles and select one that is accepting members at this time based on your interests and/or meeting day and time. You are more than welcome to attend different Circle meetings until you find one that is suitable to your needs. You can also attend one of our general meetings and meet Circle presidents there to get their information as to where they are meeting.

Once you have attended a meeting and decided on your Circle, you join through that Circle. Each Circle has different dues (between \$5 and \$10) and the Garden Club of DeLand collects \$37 for the calendar year of September through May.

The courses of study, short course, and symposiums are offered at a reasonable low cost and are a true value for those that have an interest. Members enjoy the social aspect as well. You do not need to be a gardener to join.
