YEAR OF FAVOR

If this reading from Isaiah sounds familiar, it may be because we also hear it in Luke. This is the passage that Jesus is given to

read in the synagogue, the verses he is referring to when he says, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:21). No wonder we hear it now, in anticipation of the celebration of His birth. The prophecy of Isaiah is on the cusp of fulfillment. That good news of gladness, of healing, of liberty, of vindication is here in

the person of Jesus.

What is this "year of favor: that Isaiah announces? The year of favor was traditionally the time when debts were cancelled, land was redistributed equitably, and slaves were released. It was an acknowledgment that all the goods of this world, all creation, come from God and that God ultimately has sovereignty over humanity. What implications does this have for us today? What would happen to you and all you own? Obviously, it depends on our status and what we own in the first place. But maybe we should think of it from God's perspective. God cares for each and every one of us. So if any one of us is poor, or brokenhearted, or oppressed, or held captive, it is an affront to God.

Saint Paul's advice to the early Christian community at Thessalonica is good advice for us as well. "Rejoice always," for we have been redeemed by Jesus. "Pray without ceasing," for this is how we can be in community with God. "In all circumstances give thanks" for all that we have, has been given to us. "Do not quench the spirit," for it is the Holy Spirit who builds, energizes, and sanctifies us as we act according to God's will (1 Thessalonians 5:16-19). It is also the Spirit who inspired Isaiah and Paul when they wrote the words we hear today.

For tithe figures, from September to October we took in \$77,831, that is \$13,168 short of our budget of \$91,000. Our weekly budget is \$7,000. Again, it's absolutely important that we sustain our tithe because the Capital Campaign funds are for capital repairs.

The second collection in support of the Retired Religious totaled: \$1,194.80.



IT'S TIME TO CONFESS YOUR SINS RECONCILIATION MONDAY, DECEMBER 18TH 3 P.M. TO 8 P.M. AT ST. BART'S

Once again as we enter into the final period of preparation for Christmas, the Church offers us a unique opportunity to examine our hearts and minds and cleanse our souls in the Sacrament of Penance this Monday, December 18th.

Almost every parish as set aside that afternoon and evening to welcome all the faithful. Because it is a universal experience in our Archdiocese we can stop by any church and be assured that there will be a priest present to assist in reconciling oneself to God and to the Church. If you harbor any doubts about its effectiveness in raising our spirit and giving greater meaning to the season I ask you only to return to those days of our youth. As the priest gave us our penance, we recited the Act of Contrition and received absolution, was there not a great weight lifted from us? Did we not experience a joy that we felt at no other time? Before going any further let us put our cards on the table. It if has been some time since receiving the sacrament, then realize the form of the ritual has not changed substantially. The priest will guide you. And yes, if you forgot the Act of Contrition, you can bring a cheat sheet. There might even be one in the confessional itself.

But what should I say? What sins did I commit? I can't remember them all. Let us take each issue. When we sin

we can do so by committing or omitting certain actions. We should reflect on both sides of the coin. Did we do something that was wrong that injured our relationship with God or man or was there an opportunity in witness or charity that I failed to



fulfill? We are told by the Church that to make a good confession we must admit to all mortal sins and be conscious as well of venial ones. If one has been away for some time, it is very possible that we will miss some of both kinds of sins. We must make a good faith effort to recall those offenses which are more serious. This is where a good examination of conscious is necessary. We must spend time prior to entering the confessional reflecting on our life and its pitfalls. If one forgets and later remembers a serious or less serious sin, we need not run back to the confessional. It has been forgiven as long as we did not make a conscious attempt not to mention it.
