## WEEKLY THOUGHTS 13<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JUNE 26<sup>th</sup> 2022.

Dear Friends, welcome to the celebration of the 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary time and the last Sunday in June of 2022. Let us be thankful for all the graces and blessings received over this month.

Last Sunday, we celebrated the Corpus Christi Sunday. We focused our minds to the Eucharistic Presence of Jesus. We resolved that everyone endeavor to have a personal relationship with Jesus as one spends some time before the Blessed Sacrament.

The Church celebrated the Nativity of John the Baptist on Thursday June 23<sup>rd</sup>. His birth brought great joy to Zechariah, Elizabeth and the neighborhood. He prepared the people to receive Jesus who he introduced as the Lamb of God and long awaited Messiah. John Paul II spoke of him as an enduring model of fidelity to God and his law. He prepared the way of Christ by testimony of his word and life.

On Wednesday June 29<sup>th</sup> is the Solemnity day of St. Peter and Paul- the Principal Pillars on which Jesus founded his Church. There will be Mass at 10.00 at Holy Infant and Shepherd of the Hills at 6.00 pm.

To the third, one needs total commitment and detachment from things and possessions or valuables in order to be a disciple of Jesus. Hence, it is costly to be a disciple of Jesus.
