For thousands of years, Indigenous people have walked in this land. As we gather for worship this morning, we acknowledge that we are gathered in the traditional territory of the Saulteaux, Cree, Dakota, Lakota, & Nakota First Nations and the traditional lands of the Metis, now defined as Treaty 4, and we acknowledge their stewardship of this land throughout the ages. We recognize this statement in itself is not reconciliation work - this stand-alone acknowledgment must be accompanied by multiple acts that continue to deepen our understanding of the connections between Indigenous peoples and the lands on which we are joined through the course of history and through treaty signing.



PRIDE PARADE AND FESTIVAL: June 11 will be the Queen City Pride Parade and we will be hosting the Welcoming Faiths contingent. Details to be confirmed as we hope to gather at Knox Met to prepare vehicles and signs. Becca has offered her SUV as lead vehicle. We will gather around 9:30am to decorate, and lineup starts at 11am (at 13th ave and Broad), parade at 12pm. There will be a Faith groups viewing site to watch the parade at Knox Met, depending on the route. The United Churches are hosting a Pride Communion in the park at Queen Elizabeth gardens at Wascana Park at 2pm.

The Regina Native Outreach Ministry (RNOM) is a ministry within the United Church of Canada and the Living Skies Region. Our minister is Rev. Deb Anderson-Pratt.

Our Ministry is focused on reaching out to First Nations people, empowering them to realize and share their gifts, nurturing their connection to community and Creator God, and uniting Indigenous ministries with the larger United Church of Canada.

Our hope is a future where First Nations and non-native people are repairing relationship, encouraging the voice of the voiceless, and walking the paths of our spiritualties together. RNOM's first project toward these goals was to prepare welcome and support packages for new, Indigenous moms.

This project was borne out of a personal experience where an Indigenous mom had a negative experience in hospital while delivering her baby. We wanted these new moms to feel loved and supported, and so we provided a few items to help these new moms care for their babies and themselves in the early days after the baby is born.

The Ministry assembled the bags, and they were distributed to the new Moms through the United Church's Chaplaincy Program and Native Services at the Regina General Hospital. Many thanks to Rev. Lorna King for her cooperation, encouragement and support of this project, and her help coordinating with the Chaplaincy Program. She has helped make this project possible! And thank you to all of you for your overwhelming support and donations.

The bags included the items listed below, along with a handwritten note welcoming baby, and a traditional medicine pouch. The note explained the traditional role of the medicine pouch and offered love and encouragement for the new mom.

The first distribution of bags was very successful, with so many thank yous from recipients who found the bags to be encouraging and helpful. With the overwhelming success of the project the Ministry is doing a second round of new Mom & Baby Bags with a future goal to find corporate sponsors to supply some of the items.

To support this project, RNOM is looking for donations of the following items from Regina's United Churches (ideally by June 30, 2022):

o Reusable cloth bags (for holding the items and for use later)

o Homemade cards that can are used for congratulating the new Mom on the

- arrival of her new baby
- o Knit or crocheted items for baby
- o Baby blankets or quilts
- o Unisex baby sleepers
- o Unisex baby undershirts
- o Newborn diapers
- o Baby soap
- o Baby shampoo
- o Baby wipes
- o Nursing pads
- o Sanitary supplies

o Small gifts for Mom such as a candle, hand lotion, lip balm, etc.

Donations can be dropped off at your local United Church. RNOM will collect items and hope to be making the first deliveries around June 30, 2022.
