QRS Statement on COVID-19

To all department members,

As you know COVID-19 (coronavirus) is starting to build in our state. As of now, we have not had any confirmed cases in our area. However, there have been a multitude of tests that have been sent out from our local hospitals, which means that it is probably only a matter of time before there is a positive test in our area. With this in mind I would like to lay out our precautions for responding to calls when summoned. First, it is my understanding that the 9-1-1 center will be "screening" calls and will alert responders if a patient meets potential COVID-19 criteria. However, this is not a guarantee that we will not walk into an infected persons home so please be aware of the symptoms. For those of you who do not know the symptoms they include a fever, shortness of breath, and a cough. Please wear gloves at all times when around a patient. Also in the trucks are kits that have gowns, masks, and goggles in. Should you respond to a call with a potentially infected patient please wear ALL of the items in the kit. Also I encourage everyone to read up on the DOH and the Bureau of EMS guidelines in regard to COVID-19.

Also in discussion with the chief, we are limiting the amount of responders on each QRS incident to 3 (with exception to AED/rescue calls). A driver and a max of 2 medical providers, the drivers should not exit the truck unless needed by the medical crew. This is because we only have 2 of the infection kits in the truck. Also to restrict the spread of the virus, <u>ALL</u> NON-MEDICAL providers will not be permitted on QRS calls (with the exception of AED/rescue calls.) Also please refrain from driving your personal vehicles to the scene. I know this is a lot of asking, but all of these changes will restrict the cross-contamination if you are infected. After all patient contacts, WASH YOUR HANDS. The responding unit will have SANI-CLOTHS, please take some and wipe the equipment used. Let it sit for 2 minutes prior to wiping it off or packing it away.
