will change our neighborhood and cause us to access our own Homework Center as well as other outreach efforts with those school families.

At the retreat we discussed both our congregational assets and liabilities. We spoke of missed opportunities for mission and ministry. We talked about places of conflict and things that are giving us hope and confidence. We did that from 9am to 4:30pm on Saturday. On Sunday morning after worship, we did the hard, yet fruitful, work of determining what our leadership goals would be for 2018. We settled on two. I applaud these goals because one is very internal and practical and the other external and open to the Spirit's guidance.

Goal 1 is "Getting our Administrative House in Order"

Updating the Constitution (team is in place and meeting Feb 6)
Updating our Parish Records and Archives (team is in place and working)
Adjusting our Organizational structure for greater mission (on-going assessment throughout the Spring)

Goals 2 is "Engaging in Community Conversations"

Engaging in conversation with our Mt. Hermon leaders who have been deeply involved in the Free Garage Sale and the Homework Center and who have relationships with our neighbors in poverty to determine other ways we might support them in faith and life. (On the March Council agenda)

Making use of the information the Call Committee will discover in its required conversations with community leaders. They will report their findings in the March Council meeting following their conversations with the Principal of Pineview Elementary, with the Police department, and with the City of West Columbia. Our questions to these leaders are: What are your needs? How can we help?

I'm excited and honored to be a part of this process with you!

Our Search Team for a Director of Music continues its work and we are in conversation again with a well-qualified candidate. This Spring I continue my work at the Lutheran seminary as their Coordinator for Contextual Education. I'm at the school all day Wednesday this semester and other times as required. As much as possible, I plan to be on site at Mt. Hermon on Tuesdays and Thursdays. My continued thanks for your understanding as I serve in these two positions. Please know that I am always available to you by text or call on my cell phone. Yes, I'm very busy, but you are my business! While I might not be able to attend every meeting or event to which I am invited due to this schedule, your pastoral care concerns will always be responded to as quickly as I am able. Thanks for your continued support, feedback, and prayers.

Jesus Dollars for Toby's House

Brayden Rutherford, an elementary-school student and member of Mt. Hermon, has Council's approval to raise money for Toby's Place in a fun and engaging way. Brayden will be sharing more about this project on some Sunday mornings in February and March. Toby's Place is a new homeless shelter in Columbia serving women and children. It is sponsored by Oliver Gospel Mission, an agency that has been serving homeless men in Columbia for over 127 years. The number of homeless women, with and without children, is silently growing.

Did you know 6500 Families are on the waiting list for housing in Richland County?

Did you know the typical homeless family consists of a single mother with 2 children?

Did you know more than 11,072 of SC's children experience homelessness each year?

Did you know among homeless women, 60% have children under 18?

Here's how Brayden wants to encourage his congregation to support Toby's Place. He wants to use **J-Dollars!**

When you come to church, look at the \$1 bills in your wallet.

Check the serial number on those dollar bills.

If the letter J is on a dollar bill, that's a J for Jesus!

Take those J Dollars out and put them in the basket in the Narthex on the way out of church.

We'll collect these **J Dollars** during the 40 Days of Lent and send in one big contribution to Toby's Place on Easter.

Thanks to Brayden for this great idea to support the hidden homeless in our community.

Honoring Our Neighbor's Faith is a great and very accessible book that has 32 little chapters all dedicated to describing the history and theology of a particular Christian denomination or a world religion. At the end of each chapter, they compare that faith community to the Lutheran Church, so you can see where they are similar or different. This is a helpful beginning to answer very common questions about the differences between faith groups. Pastor Anderson has five copies of this resource that you may either borrow or purchase from the church.
