Soon after the birth of my son Charlie,\* who has Down syndrome, a visitor asked whether he was "mild, moderate, or severe"—referring to his level of cognitive impairment. I was shocked. In my arms I held my beautiful baby boy, who defied easy categorization. It's like looking at stained glass from the outside: the colors look dark, and you can't see the figures. But inside, with the sun shining through, the effect can be brilliant. From inside our family, love illuminates our life with Charlie. What may seem dreary to others, perhaps even unbearable, is actually filled with beauty and color. Our love has nothing to do with his abilities. We love him simply because of who he is, and understanding this teaches us a fundamental truth: every life is a good and perfect gift.

Stages of Human Life - Month 5

"Mommy felt me kick today!" This month marks the half-way point to birth, and the baby is very active. Sleep habits develop and his/her mother can feel him/her move and stretch, particularly when she is resting. He/She is big and strong enough to kick hard against the outside of the uterine wall and dent it. Up to now, although he/she swam with ease in his/her watery world, he/she was too small for her to detect because the inside wall of the uterus has little feeling.
