Items of Interest to Our Members

Participants and viewers at the World Polio Day 2022 and **Beyond Conference**, held at the World Health Organization (WHO) provided an update of the status of polio eradication around the world. Sponsored by Rotary International and the WHO, global health leaders at the Conference expressed confidence that polio will be



eradicated worldwide and praised the frontline workers who are striving to achieve that goal. Dr. Tedros Ghebrevesus, Director-General of WHO, cited the fact that the work of the Global **Polio Eradication Initiative** (GPEI) has reduced cases by 99.9%, from 350,000 in 1988 to only six cases last year. He acknowledged, however, that the global effort has lost ground this year with 20 cases in Pakistan and two in Afghanistan - the only two countries where the transmission of the wild poliovirus has never been stopped. And the diagnosis of a polio case in the U.S., and the detection of poliovirus in sewage in the United Kingdom "show that polio will remain a global threat until it is eradicated everywhere." Polio cases have also been diagnosed in Malawi and Mozambique last year and this year. At the World Health Summit in Berlin, Germany, earlier in October, donors, including Rotary, committed US\$2.6 billion to fund the GPEI strategy. These funds will support polio immunizations in countries where polio is endemic and in those that have had recent outbreaks. It will also fund adoption of the new type 2 oral polio vaccine (nOPV2), which is a genetically modified version of a current vaccine and is less likely to cause outbreaks of circulating vaccine-derived polio, also known as variant polio.
