
Winter Cool Glasses and Popcorn Tin

These pictures are from the exhibit at the Pepsi-Cola employee's party (Mesquite plant), which was held at the info-mart in Dallas, approx. 250 people attended the Christmas party.

The table with the Santa Claus (large), (there are three tables together), contained a portion of Gary Craig's collection, he attended with his wife Ricia and has been collecting Pepsi items with a passion (never misses an antique store or flea market on his days off). For approx. 14 months, he used to work for Pepsi a few years ago and that is how he became interested in Pepsi items. Gary didn't become an avid collector until the last fourteen months and now he can't stop looking for that undiscovered Pepsi treasure.

Lawrence Cook has worked for Pepsi for the last 14 years. he works at the Mesquite location and has been the inventory control supervisor for the last 8 years. He is always interested in learning about Pepsi and the collectibles that are a part of the history of Pepsi. His wife, Lou Ann Cook, attended the Christmas party with him.

Robert Key has been collecting Pepsi items for the last 3 years. He exhibited approx. 150 bottles, out of his collection of 300, 75% of the bottles were pre-1940. The middle table and the table to the right were part of his collection. Part of the bottle exhibit included a Hutch bottle, three brown ambers, a bowling pin (or Pepsi ginger ale bottle), among others.



### **Pepsi History**

The recent Pepsi commerical featuring Ray Charles has become a big success with television viewers. Especially the new jingle "You've got the right one baby, uh huh". This made me think it may be a good time to review the history of Pepsi-Cola jingles.

Of course everyone remembers the first Pepsi jingle, "Pepsi-Cola hits the spot, twelve full ounces, that's a lot, twice as much for a nickel too, Pepsi-Cola is the drink for you". This jingle was introduced in 1939 and was used into the late 1940's in one version or another.

In 1958 Pepsi created the "Sociables" and came up with a jingle for them called "the Pepsi-cola refreshment song, Be Sociable" lyrics as follows "Be sociable, look smart keep up to date with Pepsi, drink lite refreshing Pepsi, stay young n fair n debonair, be sociable, have a Pepsi".

In 1962 Pepsi decided to think young with this catchy tune titled "The Pepsi Song": "The lively crowd to day agrees those who think young say, Pepsi please! They pick the right one the modern light one Now it's Pepsi! For those who think young! active set that's in the know prefer the cleaner taste and so they pick the right one the bracing bright one. Now it's Pepsi! For those who think young! When you say Pepsi please you're putting yourself among people who like their leisure with Pepsi! the drink that's young. So go ahead and pick the drink that lets you drink young as you think Yes! get the right one!

The light one! Now, it's Pepsi for those who think young!".

To go along with 1967 "Taste that Beats the others cold" theme, Anne Phillips came up with this nice little ditty. "Taste that beats the others cold Pepsi pours it on. Anytime a thrist takes hold Pepsi pours it on. Pepsi's got that special taste created for the cold the cold turns on that Pepsi drive makes Pepsi-Cola come alive Taste that beats the others cold Pepsi pours it on.

In 1973 Pepsi was "feelin' free" with this Pepsi-Cola song "Feelin' Free": There's a feelin' around, it's America's sound, Pepsi people feelin' free free to choose a new way, free to stand up and say "you be you and I'll be me" When you catch that thirst for livin', then you'll need what Pepsi's givin' a Pepsi lift, the Pepsi gift, for feelin' free Join the Pepsi people feelin' free, feelin' free, join the Pepsi people".

Soon after "Feelin' Free" Pepsi decided that maybe they needed to "Catch that Pepsi Spirit" so here's the way David Lucas thought Pepsi should "Catch that Pepsi Spirit": It's the smilin' shinin' feelin' The light of a brand new day and your're the Pepsi generation you're the spirit of today. There's a feelin' deep inside you a spirit you just can't hide and with every taste of life that's new well that Pepsi spirit shines right through. 



It's our 1991 goal to develop more local chapters of the PCCC. So if your interested in starting a local club please let us know.



# Collectors' Spotlight

A DECADE OF PEPSI COLLECTING By Karen Weaver

I live in central Missouri and began my Pepsi collection in 1980. There are many flea markets and antique shops within a few hours drive from my home and Pepsi collectibles were fairly easy to find in 1980. There didn't seem to be much competition from other collectors. At auctions, my only competition was antique dealers and I could usually out bid them. But all of that has changed as the popularity of Pepsi collecting has grown. The pickings at shops is leaner and Pepsi collecting has grown more expensive, especially with the advent of books on Pepsi collectibles that list values.

I have a wide variety of Pepsi items in my collection that includes clocks, radios, coolers, bottles, cans, cups, drums, trays, etc. Among my

favorites are my Pepsi & Pete cups (four cups in mint condition), a 1960 dispenser radio, and a 1910 Pepsi notebook. It's really difficult to select favorites because every item has been a favorite at one time or another.

Character Pepsi glasses have always been plentiful in central Missouri and they have become my hottest items. I collect them with a passion.

I have hundreds of items in my collection. I have the collection catalogued on computer disk, which is probably a wise move since I warehouse my collection at my parents home and they are also into collectibles. The house is like a "These People are Screwballs" museum.

Fortunately, they don't collect any type of soft drink advertising, except to keep an eye out for Pepsi items that I don't have.

I have been a member of the club for seven years and have been able to attend every Indianapolis convention except the first one. I look forward to them because they are climactic events for each year of collecting.

If I have any advice for new or would be collectors it is that if you train all of your relatives, co-workers, neighbors, and friends the right way, you can get an avalanche of Pepsi items for every birthday and Christmas, and make "pickers" out of them It's fun to hunt Pepsi but it's even better to get surprises. If my collection grows during the second decade like it has during this first one, then I might get an even bigger surprise. The folks may someday demand that I help them buy a bigger house.

### Collectors' Information

CAVEAT EMPTOR - Let the buyer beware. In recent years the quanity and quality of reproduced and fantasy Pepsi collectibles has greatly increased. It is my belief that if you choose to buy these items that's your choice. But I'm deeply offended by the number of antique dealers who try to pass these collectibles off as old. They use phrases like, "just found new old stock", "the guy I bought it from guarantees these are old". Although most antique dealers are fair and honest you must protect yourself from the ones that aren't. Anytime your unsure of the authenticity of an item ask the dealer to guarantee it in writing. If he won't, I would seriously consider NOT buying that item because chances are he knows it's not old.

Here are some of the current crop of reproduced and fantasy items:



Celluloid button most likely the artwork for the button was taken from a 1940's coaster. These buttons are circulating very heavily right now. The going price of these reproduced buttons is about \$12.00.



This sign is a reproduction of a sign from 1951. Besides being a reproduction this sign has a couple of problems. The reproducer is using the wrong color background, he has the background in yellow it should be in white. The five cents was dropped from bottle signs by 1951.



This last reproduction sign, although attractive, is using an early 1900's logo with the red, white, and blue bottle cap that wasn't used until the mid 1940's.

As you can see the manufacturers of the above reproductions don't care about accuracy, they are only in it for the money.

Good luck collecting and rememeber the basic tenent of business law "Caveat Emptor - let the buyer beware"
