<u>Parsha Pekudei</u>- In Parsha Pekudei, we see the people beginning to set up the tabernacle, establishing the accounts, vestments worn as well as erecting the actual edifice. Think of your home. What are some ways you establish a Jewish home. What makes your home unique?

In our home, we have some of the same things used in the temple, i.e. Torah scrolls, oils, siddur, etc. We do this so what's experienced in service, is just an extension of what's already practiced in our home. We have a unique home because we try to replicate what's in Torah/The Holy Scriptures as realistically as possible. For example, we pray after we eat, not before. We have space used for meditation/reflection. Additionally, the previous owners of our home were Jewish, so we believe we inherited a blessed space by observant believers. We're continuing to live kosher and cozy!

I don't necessarily think that it is important per-say to make our home 'Jewish' as much as it is essential for us to treat our home as a place where the Most High can dwell. When people visit, they have often relayed that they felt peace in our home and I believe that is a reflection of the way in which we govern our lives from day to day inside the home. Although we have some fallacies and may not always exhibit positive behaviors, we try to divest ourselves of those thins that would prevent the continuity of peace. Furthermore, we try to embody all of the positive moralistic values that we read and study in Torah. We emphasize to our children the importance of prayer and we demonstrate how to live Torah. I think the thing that is unique about our home is even before we moved in we prayed and had prayer go before within and afterwards, now we continue to pray and our children send of praises and prayers. Our home is a place of peace and praises to the Most High as we constantly remind him of how thankful we are to have been given such a great gift.

<u>Parsha Vayikra</u> - Parsha Vayikra focuses heavily on offerings and rituals and sacrifices. While rituals are necessary in the spiritual sense, they can be problematic in the natural sense. We also have television shows that we watch together, just as a way to unwind. We try to respect each other's personal hobbies and interests and let each other spend time doing things individually. My husband likes to decompress by listening to music, bowling or playing the drums. I try not to bother him when he's doing that. I like to read novels, listen to music and am into nerdy stuff like Comicon, Marvel/DC and anything related to Lord of the Rings. We also do fun activities with our kids, so they grow up knowing that while there's a time for work, there's also time to play.



SPOTLIGHT SHEBREWS



1. What kind of business do you have and what do you do?

I own an apparel design business. I design custom religious garments as well as clothing.

2. How did the idea for your business come about?

Our communities have some of the most wonderful members who like to look different. The need for custom shawls and Tallit has increased as our understanding for Torah grew. *Shebrews* is known for costume tallit's (no one is the same unless requested). I wanted to not only to make things, but I wanted to them look professional. Therefore, I attend Philadelphia Art Institute of Philadelphia to learn how to make better-looking garments.

3. What was the driving force for you to work for yourself?

My driving force for being an entrepreneur is to eventually, become self-sufficient. No more punching clocks. My ultimate reason is to make a positive name for myself so that that my children, parents and other family members can be proud of me.

4. How did you come up with the name for your business?

The name "Shebrews" came about in a conversation with friends. We were watching a movie by Tyler Perry. There was a punch line about why men do not make the coffee. We laughed about it for a minute. I thought it was a cool concept for an Israelite designer as myself, because even if she brews, he can still partake.

5. How do you build a successful client base?

My clientele has been word of mouth; however, I am looking to expand in the near future. An Etsy store will be opening soon!

6. Was it hard to raise funding for your business? or What are some ways you fund your business?

Raising funds for the business can be a challenge. Becoming an LLC has allowed *Shebrews* to receive business credit and separates my personal money from the business funds.

7. What advice would you give others looking to start their own business?

Be focused and have a clear idea what you want to accomplish. Do not be afraid to ask for help. Seek out people who are willing to pass on the knowledge of the business.

8. What is it about your business that makes it unique?

The Shebrews brand is unique because I try to make the shawls fit the personality of the person wearing it. It is not limited to just shawls. I make other items as well.




