## *The Reverend's Ruminations - November 2022*

What is it about the shorter days and cooler temperatures that makes us crave more "comfort food"? Have you started baking already, or made your first batch of chili? Maybe you purchased some additional ham loaves and mustard sauce like we did after the annual Fall Festival Ham Loaf Dinner? Even if you didn't, I bet you can still taste that delicious church meal. Attendance may not have been what it was ten or more years ago (when the tables would have to be reset more than once), but the meal was every bit as good. It takes a lot of work—and no small bit of organization—to bring together an event like this, and for that I want to say a huge THANK YOU to our Hospitality Board and all the additional volunteers that made it successful once again!

Seeing Heritage Hall filled with church and community members enjoying a great meal, supporting our church financially, I am reminded of the blessing of being called to pastor such an active and vibrant church now six years ago. Your love, support, time, and efforts—whether large or small—help First Congregational UCC continue to put its best foot forward in this community and share the gospel of Christ with a world longing for hope.

As I prepared to "ruminate" about November activities and challenges, I happened across a recent mailing from Rev. Dr. John Dorhauer, the General Minister and President of the United Church of Christ. In it, he addresses what many of us are experiencing these days. Let me include a portion of it here for you to ruminate upon as well:

*"We are a people divided, a country split on too many issues to name. And many are the powers that thrive on keeping us divided, pitting one person or group against another.*

*But you are different. You are part of the United Church of Christ. You are about loving God and neighbor. You are about building bigger tables. You are about giving everyone a voice. You are about uniting across our divisions to join with the Holy Spirit in working toward a just world for all.*

*You are about upholding the democratic principles of social equity and the equal power of each person made in God's image...*

*...Together we are stronger than the divisions. Together our churches are stronger in witness to Christ's love for all people. Together we offer extravagant welcome and radical hospitality to a world seeking lives of deeper meaning and greater value."*

Yes, this was also a letter seeking financial support for the UCC Annual Fund. But in much the same way that we have been speaking about the call to share "Love, Time, and Money" during our own *Growing in Generosity, Rooted in Faith* stewardship campaign, being a Christian—and a United Church of Christ member in particular—calls us to a deeper understanding of world events, institutional policies, community struggles, and individual relationships. Rather than allow ourselves to be pulled into the chasm of fear, hate, or division so prominent in our country (and accentuated by scheming mid-term election ads), we are called to rise above the politicism of seemingly every detail of public life. We are called instead to model Christ's grace, love, and care for those around us. The Apostle Paul put it this way when he wrote to a young Christian congregation in Colossae:

*"As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom... And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." (Colossians 3:12-17, NRSV)*

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES FOR 10-19-2022**

**Members Present:** Abigail Anderson, Kay Campe, Marilyn Forstrom, Dave Adams, Ellen Germain, Cathy Celander, Catherine Johnson, Eric Johnson, Larry Lasch and Christina Hainy. Ex-officio members present: Pastor Cory Germain, Dara Bliesmer, Ass't Treasurer.

The Council met in the Fireside Room at 5:45 PM. The meeting was called to order by Moderator Abigail Anderson. Pastor Cory led in prayer. Minutes of the September 21 meeting were approved as printed. Motion M/S/C (Dave/Kay).

**Treasurer's Report:** Catherine Johnson reported that investments are fluctuating at the moment. She is in process to close the Parsonage Fund and move it into the General Operating Reserve prior to year-end. The financial report looks a little different. The Brodt donation is now listed after our ending checking account balance. The year-to-date offerings are at 67% of budget. Proposed budget requests are due to Catherine by Nov. 14. Motion was M/S/C (Ellen/Marilyn) to receive the Treasurer's report.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Cory reported on his activities. He is currently attending Zoom meetings with other pastors to talk about racism. He has a family event coming up: Emma's wedding on Nov. 19. The Sunday church worship service will be at St. John's UCC with wedding reception after at First Congregational on Nov.20.

**BOARD REPORTS:**

**Christian Education:** Ellen Germain reported that Christmas play practices will be Nov. 16 &30 and Dec. 7 & 14. Meal at 5:30 PM and practice 6-6:45 PM. The Shrek-themed Christmas play written by Abby will be performed on December 18. Gingerbread houses will be made on December 4 after church.

**Hospitality:** Cathy Celander reported that they have been busy with Harvest Festival preparations. There will be an in-person Cookie Walk on Dec. 2 with a baking day on Nov. 11.

**Facilities:** Larry Lasch reported that the outside step project is completed. Council took a trip into Heritage Hall to look at old steam pipe coverings on the ceiling that have been dropping pieces. Motion was M/S/C to repair these coverings up to \$800. (Marilyn/Amanda) John Thate has trimmed some trees around the church, but hasn't asked to be paid. A motion was M/S/C to pay him \$300 for his work. (Dave/Ellen)

**Diaconate:** Eric Johnson shared that Diaconate board is doing the Oct. 26 Community Meal with chili as a main dish. They are working on updating the active member list. It costs the church \$10/active member each year. They think there are about 9 members to be moved from active membership. Also, they are working on definitions of different member categories and trying to simplifying lists. They will be looking for any glass Communion cups in the church.

**Missions:** Amanda Forstrom reported that the November Blessing Box is designated for Church World Services - "Best Gift." A variety of different gifts are available to view at [cwsbestgift.org](http://cwsbestgift.org). The September Free Community Meal hosted by the Chubb House volunteers served 122 meals. The Mission board will serve the November Free Community Meal and make a change to no drive-thru service offered.

**Worship:** Dave Adams reported that the Sentinel has been updated to reflect 9:30 Worship/Sunday school and discussed where else needs to be updated. Discussion of 9:30 AM time. Nov. 6 is All Saints day, and Nov. 20 is a joint worship at St. John's UCC. Talked about investing in banners, decorations, and stoles for Joyce/music. A guitar player is needed also.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:** The Stewardship/pledge campaign is on Oct 23. Kay is sending out a reminder on Facebook, and Pastor Cory will have a reminder in his weekly email. The Budget committee meeting will be on Nov. 28 with a 5:30 PM meal/6 PM meeting. This includes Council, a rep from each board and at-large members. Marilyn is working on the slate.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Christina Hainy was hired for the administrative assistant position.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Discussion about signs in front of church. The sign by the Free Little Pantry has rotted posts. A motion was M/S/C to remove the sign by the Pantry. (Kay/Ellen) The Glows Parade is on Nov. 18, and we will plan for food at the church.

Pastor Cory closed the meeting with a prayer, and Moderator Abigail Anderson adjourned the meeting.

## HyVee & Fareway Receipts Report as of 16 October 2022

During the last three weeks \$21,927.44 (14.62%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 26 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$111,114.40 (74.08%) toward the 15<sup>th</sup> \$150,000 goal. There is a good chance that the \$150,000 goal will be met yet this year.

During the same three weeks, \$4,325.79 (2.88%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 93 weeks, Fareway is at \$123,920.07 (82.61%) toward our 4<sup>th</sup> \$150,000 goal. It will still take about 20 weeks to reach the \$150,000.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Gas, Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house. Even the very small amounts help.





## **Caramel Apple Walnut Bars**

- |                             |                                       |
|-----------------------------|---------------------------------------|
| <b>1 3/4 C. flour</b>       | <b>1 C. butter</b>                    |
| <b>1 C. quick oatmeal</b>   | <b>20 unwrapped caramels</b>          |
| <b>1/2 C. brown sugar</b>   | <b>1 can sweetened condensed milk</b> |
| <b>1/2 tsp. baking soda</b> | <b>1 can apple pie filling</b>        |
| <b>1/2 tsp. salt</b>        | <b>1 C. Chopped walnuts</b>           |

**Combine flour, oatmeal, brown sugar, baking soda and salt; cut butter in until crumbly. Reserve 1 1/2 C. of this crumb mixture for later. Pat remaining mixture into a greased 9 x 13" cake pan. Bake for 15 minutes at 350 degrees. During this time, heat the caramels and sweetened condensed milk over low heat until melted. Spoon apple filling onto crust. Then, top with the caramel mixture. Add the chopped walnuts to the reserved crumb mixture and put on top. Bake another 20-30 minutes until set.**
