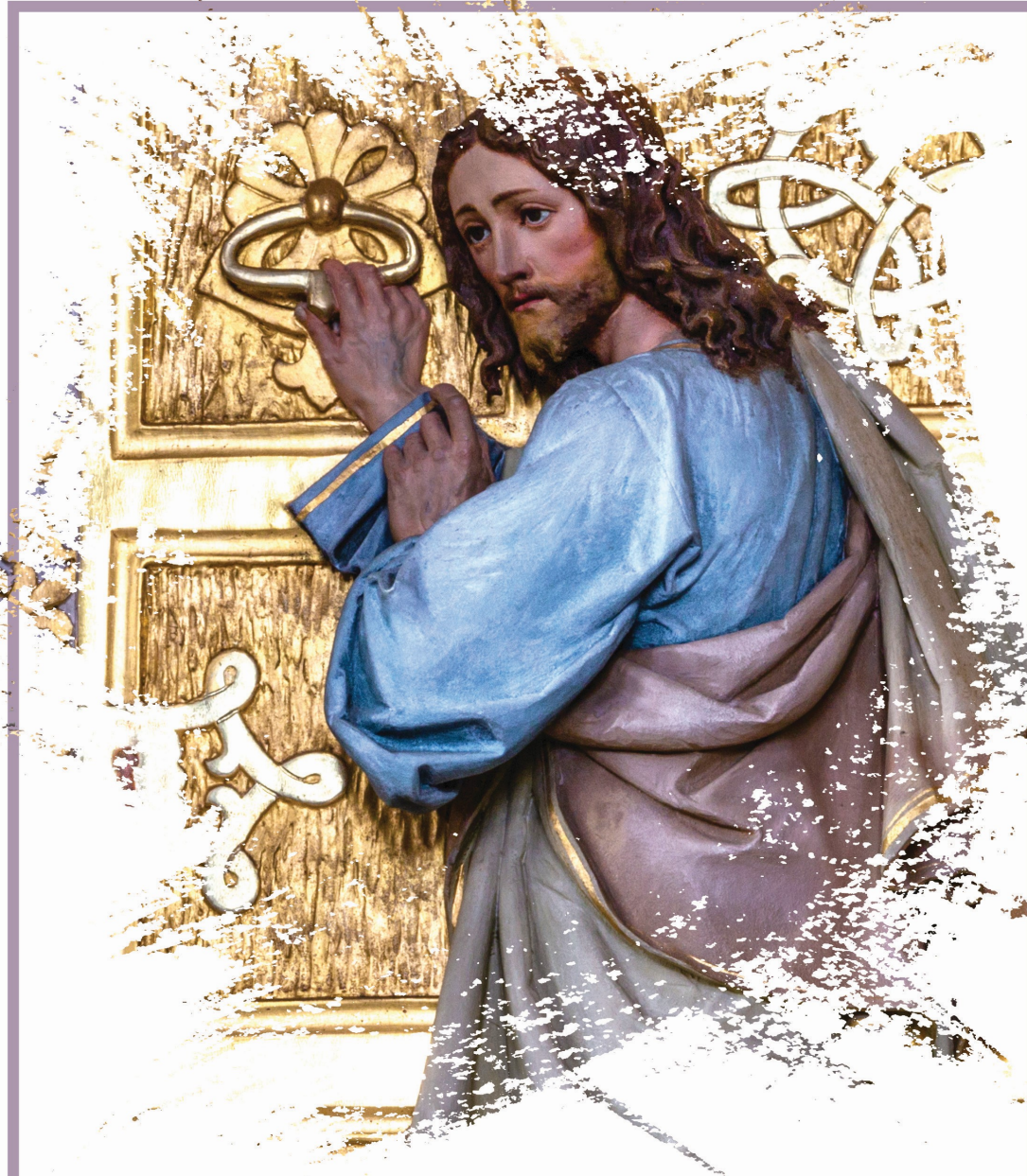

Communion of Saints

The month of November starts with All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day Celebrations. These celebrations remind us of a teaching of the Church: Communion of Saints. It is expressed in one of the four pillars of the Catholic Church: One (the other three are Holy, Catholic & Apostolic). The oneness of the Church explains the unity of the universal Church that includes the three states of the Church: Triumphant, Suffering, and Militant. The Triumphant Church includes the saints and holy people who are in Heaven, the Suffering Church includes the souls in Purgatory who are waiting to be reunited with God and the Militant Church includes the people here on earth who are fighting the battle of sin and temptation. The Communion of Saints tells us that the *Triumphant Church* prays and intercedes for the Suffering and Militant Churches. The *Militant Church* prays for the Suffering Church and prays with the Triumphant Church for themselves since they are journeying to Heaven. The interrelatedness of the three states of the Church tells us that we are one and we can be greatly helpful to one another in many ways.

If you wish to express appreciation for the music ministers, please do **NOT** clap after the closing song. Instead, approach us after Mass has concluded and express your appreciation.

Music ministers perform a ministry, using our talents to bring the congregation into worship in the liturgy; we are not putting on a performance. Clapping for the music ministers takes the attention away from God.

We do not clap after a lector proclaims the Word of God, or after the priest gives his homily, after the ushers take up the collection, or after the Eucharistic ministers finish administering the Eucharist. To do so would be an interruption to the Liturgy and completely inappropriate. Clapping after the music ministers have completed their service in the Mass is the same.

Please do not clap after the closing song.

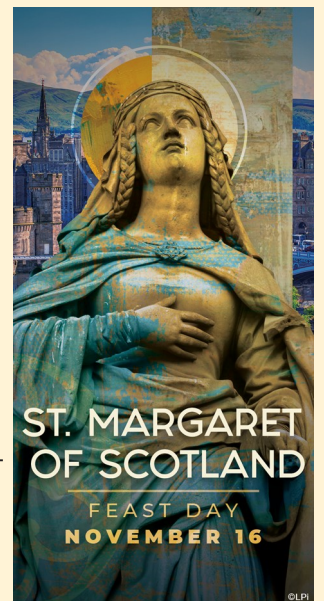

Saint Margaret of Scotland | November 16

Saint Margaret was born in exile around 1045, in what is now Hungary. She is the daughter of Princess Agatha of Hungary and Edward the Atheling the Anglo-Saxon heir to the throne of England. The family returned to England, but Edward died soon after their arrival, making Margaret's brother Edgar the presumptive heir. However, the Norman Conquest would turn their world upside down. Agatha and her children fled the country. They likely intended to go back to Hungary, but they were shipwrecked off the coast of Scotland. King Malcolm Canmore III took the exiles under his wing, and he fell in love with the beautiful and gracious Margaret. Although she initially rebuffed his proposals, the couple were married in 1070 at castle of Dunfermline. Margaret and Malcolm had eight children, six sons and two daughters. Margaret brought culture to the Scottish court and used her influence to soften her rough husband. The saint led a life of austerity, aiding Church reform, promoting Easter communion, and founding churches and monasteries. She instituted the Queen's Ferry to the shrine of St. Andrew and founded pilgrimage hostels.

Saint Margaret, Queen of Scotland, died on November 16, 1093, four days after her husband and eldest son were killed in the battle of Alnwick. She was canonized by Pope Innocent IV in 1250 and named patron of Scotland in 1673. ©LPI
