#### **MARCH BOARD MEETING SYNOPSIS**

- Review of Minutes: Minutes from the March board meeting were approved.
- <u>Financial Report</u>: Offerings for February were \$6,550.00 and expenses were \$6,242,40. We had extra expenses this month with the purchase of women's bibles, mother's day gifts and CCLI license.
- <u>Painting of Library, Bathrooms and Office:</u> The board approved for Prominence Painting & Remodeling to paint the trim in the library, hallway, bathrooms, office and doors for the cost of \$2,900.00.
- <u>Pastor Contract:</u> Marilyn Chamberlin, Kimberly Tisserand, and Kenny Bean drafted and reviewed the initial Pastor Contract. The entire board including Doc Gardner will review and send corrections to Kimberly Tisserand. The board will vote on this contract next month.
- <u>CD changes for bank:</u> Marilyn Chamberlin went to Bancorp South Bank and closed out our four CD's. The bank transferred
  - the money from the CD's into our checking account. Danielle Chamberlin will go to the bank and set up our savings account. Danielle Chamberlin will leave \$25,000 in our checking account and transfer the rest into our savings account; and in the future if we have more than \$20,000, Danielle Chamberlin can transfer the excess to savings.
- <u>Fence clean out and replacement:</u> Josh Babb's business U.S. Site Services came and cleaned out the fence area and removed the old fence. Mike Poen donated \$500.00 for the clean out and this amount will be paid to U.S. Site Services. Marilyn Chamberlin will contact Rodney Ploch for a quote to put in a new fence.
- Mother's Day Celebration May 8, 2022. Gifts have been purchased for all the mothers in the congregation.
- 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade plans: The board will brainstorm some ideas for the float. WE need to find a volunteer to oversee our float for this upcoming year. Doc Gardner will announce during service to see if anyone wants to volunteer.
- Next board meeting will be May 1, 2022.

#### HYMN OF THE MONTH—"WHAT THE LORD HAS DONE IN ME"

Reuben Morgan is the Worship Pastor at Hillsong Church in London. Before this he was Worship Pastor at Hillsong Church in Sydney, Australia, replacing Darlene Zchech in 2008. In the late 1990s, Morgan helped lead and develop the worship team for Hillsong's Youth Group, Powerhouse. This band eventually grew into Hillsong United. Some of Morgan's better known songs include "Hear our Praises," "My



Redeemer Lives," and "Lord I Give You My Heart." He released his first solo worship album, World Through Your Eyes, in 2005. He and his wife Sarah have three children.

"What the Lord Has Done in Me" can be read as a surprisingly subtle song of baptism. It draws parallels between the images of baptism and the death and resurrection of Christ, which many Christians take to be essential to the saving work of God. The form of the verses goes like this: a declaration of faith and hope; a symbolic representation of the death of Christ; a symbolic representation of the resurrection of Christ; a restatement of the first declaration in assurance.
