Dick Hodnefield and his wife, Gayle, graduated from a square dance class in the spring of 1972 in St. Paul, Minn. In August of that same

year, Dick attended a weekend New Caller School. He had no intentions of ever becoming a caller, Dick just had to know how it worked! By the end of the weekend, he was hooked.

By September of 1973, he had become the club teacher and caller for three clubs in the St. Paul area. Dick also started his own club, the Spin Chain Gang in September 1980. Dck was the teacher for the Trail Dusters for twenty years, from 1981 to 2001. He became the class teacher for the Boots and Slippers of Simi Valley, and he is still teaching for that club today.




