Blast from the Past Dorothy Trigg

This is the last article I will be writing as I am graduating with my Master's degree. Before I tell you about this week's article I wanted to let you know that I am so grateful for all the love and support that I received from every one of you the last year and a half while I have been attending graduate school.

I have been saving this article to share for the Christmas season. As some of you may know, we used to have a magazine called "The Visitor." During Christmas 1975, a story appeared that shares why we started the tradition of celebrating Nativity plays. Since the article appeared as a narrative, and too long to fit here, I will summarize it for you. In 1223, Greccio, Italy, Saint Francis of Assisi felt that his parish was suffering from a lack of faith at Christmas time, and so in order to help bring the story to life, he decided to show it to them. He approached local shepherds, a young couple, and farmers to set up a cave. Then, on Christmas Eve, he led his congregation to the cave that had been set up to look like the Nativity Scene. There they saw, the Nativity scene complete with animals, shepherds, and local magistrates dressed up like the 3 Kings. The young couple had a newborn baby that they had laid in the manger. That was the first Nativity Scene, and it worked, inspiring a great many people. His homily reminded his parishioners of the miracle of Christ coming as a small child.

He spoke not only of the baby Jesus, but also of Jesus the man, and implored his listeners to follow Jesus' way of loving kindness... He knew that Christmas-the real Christmas had come that night to the little village of Greccio, Italy.

Daily Mass... Why Go?

1. Recall the first time you attended a daily Mass.

A sense of well-being.

3. Why do you still attend daily Mass? What is the benefit you feel from it?

This sense of well-being and the wish to get a spiritual uplift. It seems to be the best way to begin my day. It is hard to keep the spiritual in focus.

4. Thinking of those who have never attended daily Mass, what would you want to say to encourage those who could attend but do not?

Try it and let the Lord do his work within you. It is the closest we get to Heaven on this Earth. At my age I need as much as possible. I keep pushing the Lord to the edge of my being. He needs to be kept at the center.





