The Cost of Following Jesus, its Challenges and its Blessings

Scripture readings for this Sunday call upon us to embrace the discipleship of Jesus not as a religion of devotion and self-satisfaction, but a service of commitment and self-sacrifice. In the first reading Jeremiah reflects on the cost of being God's faithful Mouthpiece. The more He condemned corruption, shifting alliances and oppression of the leaders of the time, the more He was attacked by His own people. In the end He remained faithful to His mission, showing what it meant to live as a person of integrity, to have the moral courage to walk the long road of fidelity to God's principles- not the world's. Jesus also expected such courage and commitment of the disciples. "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me."

As Jesus taught and lived, Christian discipleship consisted of walking the path of "the Son of Man who came not to be served, but to serve and to give his life for others." And surely this was the path Jesus walked, putting His own security aside to identify with the sufferings of others -listening and comforting the sorrowful and the fearful, embracing those considered unclean and outcast, healing the afflicted and witnessing that nothing could ever separate them from the all-embracing of God their loving Father.

This did not mean that suffering was something followers should actively seek for its own sake. As His grief in the garden of Gethsemane made clear, suffering was the price He and His disciples would pay for acting justly, loving tenderly and walking humbly with our God by challenging openly -as the prophet Jeremiah was impelled to do- harsh and unjust practices in the world that excluded and oppressed to reframe an alternative vision of hope, love, solidarity and service in union with Jesus for the benefit of others.

Truly the readings call us today to a deeper understanding of discipleship, uncomfortable though it may feel. But it is not about seeking out hardship for its own sake or to merit heaven. Paul, in his letter to the Romans is inviting us all to put on the mind of God. We are invited to enter into the paschal mystery with Jesus where suffering is not the end, and power and authority are not markers of success. Authentic discipleship shares - as Jesus did -the daily joys and sorrows of people, especially those most in need, comforting and assuring them through our friendship and actions of God's love for them as a caring Father who shares their pain, who walks the long road with them and is present in loving words and actions of another when times are hardest. But most of all, assuring them that nothing can take away their inherent dignity and worth in the eyes of God, their Loving Father.

Jesus revealed to us His image of God as "Abba" – one of the first utterances a growing infant makes. "Abba" – a doting loving Father who walks by his side as he learns to walk, 'leading him away from danger, grieving when he is lost and running out to

welcome him home when he has gone astray.

Today on this Father's day we say "Thank you" to all fathers and those who have embraced this role to care, lovingly guide and protect the most vulnerable amongst us. Thank you!!!

Welcome Friends, to the Season of Creation which starts each year on 1 September, the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on 4 October, the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. The Season of Creation is a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and all creation through celebration, conversion, and commitment. It is a global ecumenical celebration where we pray and act together as a Christian family for our common home.

A mighty river is this year's theme, inspired by the words of the prophet Amos: "Let justice flow on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream" (5:24). In his message for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, Pope Francis explains that the image used by Amos speaks to us of what God desires. God wants justice to reign; it is as essential to our life as water is essential for our physical survival. Pope Francis reminds us that when we "seek first the kingdom of God" (Mt 6:33), maintaining a right relationship with God, humanity and nature, then justice and peace can flow like a never-failing stream of pure water, nourishing humanity and all creatures."

So how do we join the river of justice and peace? What can we do to heal the wounds of our common home? Pope Francis calls us to transform our hearts, our lifestyles, and the public policies ruling our societies. This transformation is what's called an ecological conversion, something we'll dive into more deeply over the Season of Creation.
