





program, and sign-up on the bulletin board. It is our opportunity to care for the children, and truthfully, we cannot do this without help from our community.

In June and July, we will be experimenting with the scripture used for preaching. In June, it will vary from Acts 2:21 for Pentecost to Proverbs 8 where we will explore the call of woman wisdom. Then, we will move on to two Sundays where we will spend time in Galatians.

July will be a month of surprises, starting with the scripture text for preaching. The second surprise is Vacation Bible School from July 14-16. Be ready for "Yee Haw." The third surprise is Outdoor Worship on July 21. These are surprises because they are new, for us.

Since Easter Sunday, we have been focusing on preaching text from Acts. As Christians, we have been challenged every Sunday. On the 2nd Sunday of Easter, we were challenged to be bold and to stand up for our faith, rather than be silent.

On the 3rd Sunday of Easter, we learned that an unlikely friendship came about between Saul and Ananias. Our challenge is not to judge, but to be open to others so we can appreciate what each person brings to the relationship as we follow Jesus.

The 4th Sunday of Easter was where Peter learned from Jesus how he was to heal people and even bring them back to life. Had he not been listening to Jesus and soaking up what he was being taught, he would not have been able to reach out to those in need.

On the 5th Sunday there was an unexpected change of menu, where Peter was adamant that he would not eat the things he had been taught were unclean. God had a different plan for Peter. He was challenged to let go of old

ways and be open to God's voice.

All of the scripture passages from Acts are letting us know how important it is not to get set in our ways as Christians. God called us. God has a plan for us, and God's plan is seldom what we think it should be. As we move into a summer of more surprises, let us all remem-

ber that God is walking with us, and that Jesus is an astonishing teacher who is there to show us the way. Let this summer be a summer of openness and learning how you can reach out to others, surprising yourself!



PENTECOST SUNDAY JUNE 9TH

Pentecost Sunday is on June 19th and we are asking everyone to wear red. The color

red symbolizes joy and the fire of the Holy Spirit. Ministers wear red vestments and it has become a modern custom for the congregation to wear red clothing in celebration as well.

JUNE/JULY MISSION FOCUS

The June and July mission focus is the Bdecan Church, a Dakota Presbytery church located south of Tokio, ND on the Spirit Lake Reservation. "Bdecan" (pronounced Bah-DAY Chan) means "Wood Lake" in the Dakota language. Bdecan Presbyterian Church is the only Indian Presbyterian Church in the State of North Dakota. It was founded as a mission church in 1879 and formally organized in 1881.

Joe Obermeyer was hired in the spring of 2013 as the Youth and Outreach Co-Bdecan ordinator at Presbyterian Church. Joe provides programming for the children and youth year round. He also coordinates volunteers from outside the church during the summer months. Joe states, "This position is going to be an amazing experience. I do not consider this to be a job; instead I consider this position to be a vocation. I am convinced that God has brought me into this place at this moment."

The mission of the Bdecan Presbyterian Church of Tokio, North Dakota on the Spirit Lake Dakota Nation is to grow as Christ's witness in their community and reservation worshipping God through

prayer, helping each other, fellowship, and Sunday morning wor-While keeping ship. Christ's love at their center and supporting each one's spiritual journey, they move towards eternal life as body to fulfill one God's will on earth. (adopted by the Bdecan Session November 1, 2009)
