

2015 Burlington County Farm Fair Health/Testing Requirements by Species

These requirements apply to animals originating within New Jersey. For questions or requirements for out-of-state animals, please contact the Farm Fair Veterinarian.

Species	Requirements
Cattle	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. USDA Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) <u>or</u> Current Animal Health Certificate (AHC) within 30 days 2. Proof of rabies vaccination (current within one year)- can be documented on health certificate
Goats	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. USDA Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) <u>or</u> Current Animal Health Certificate (AHC) within 30 days 2. Proof of rabies vaccination (current within one year)- can be documented on health certificate 3. All goats must be identified by USDA approved official identification. (Approved ear tag and/or tattoo <u>or</u> USDA approved microchip.)
Horses	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. USDA Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) <u>or</u> Current Animal Health Certificate (AHC) within 30 days 2. Proof of rabies vaccination (current within one year)- can be documented on health certificate 3. Negative Coggins test <i>within the last 12 months</i>. MUST MATCH INFORMATION ON CVI/AHC! (Horses younger than 6 months and accompanied by a dam that has a negative official Coggins test are exempt from testing. Horses that are to change owners via sale, barter, or trade shall have a negative Coggins test within 90 days prior to exchange.) 4. Vaccination for Equine Herpes Virus (aka Rhino or EHV) current within 6 months is <i>strongly recommended</i>.
Camelids (Llama/Alpaca)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. USDA Certificate of Veterinary Inspection <u>or</u> Current Animal Health Certificate within 30 days 2. Proof of rabies vaccination (current within one year)- can be documented on health certificate
Poultry	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Current Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) <u>or</u> Current Animal Health Certificate (AHC) <u>or</u> VS-Form 9-2/3 <u>or</u> 4-H Poultry, Rabbit, or Cavy Health Form. 2. All poultry, including exhibition, exotic, and game birds (including ostrich, emu and rhea but excluding waterfowl and pigeons) shall originate from U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean or equivalent flocks, <u>OR</u> All poultry over 4 months of age shall have an individual Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days. Turkeys shall be blood tested at more than 12 weeks of age. Game birds shall be tested when more than 4 months of age or upon reaching sexual maturity, whichever comes first. Ostrich, emu, rhea and cassowaries shall be blood tested when more than 12 months of age. All ostrich, emus, rhea and cassowaries less than twelve months shall originate from Pullorum-Typhoid negative flocks. All birds less than four months of age shall originate from Pullorum-Typhoid negative flocks (the individual test is not valid for birds in this age group).
Rabbit/Cavy/Ferret	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Current Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) <u>or</u> Current Animal Health Certificate (AHC) <u>or</u> 4-H Poultry, Rabbit, or Cavy Health Form. 2. FERRETS ONLY: Proof of current rabies vaccination (current within one year). Vaccination by a licensed veterinarian is required; documentation on a 4-H Health Form does not qualify as proof of vaccination.
Sheep	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Current Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection <u>or</u> Current Animal Health Certificate 2. Proof of current rabies vaccination (current within one year or three years depending on vaccine) 3. All sheep must be identified by USDA approved official identification (Approved ear tag and/or tattoo <u>or</u> USDA approved microchip.)
Swine (includes pot bellied pigs)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. USDA Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) <u>or</u> Current Animal Health Certificate (AHC) within 30 days 2. Proof of rabies vaccination (current within one year)- can be documented on health certificate 3. *NEW FOR 2105* Proof of negative Swine Enteric Coronavirus test within 30 days prior to entry.
