The Eternal Glory of Easter

In this Vale of Tears we lead lives afflicted by sin and always in the shadow of death. Christ came to free us from the chains of sin and to prove to us that death is not an end, but merely our beginning in infinity. My mother died thirty years ago on Easter Sunday 1984. Because of Easter I know that I will see her again, along with my son who died last year on Pentecost. Without either hope or love we are but poor creatures indeed. Easter gives us hope and tells us that we are children of a loving God. Saint Augustine reminds us of these great truths:

The Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ is the new life of believers in Jesus; and this is the mystery of His Passion and Resurrection, which you ought well to know and to carry out in act. For not without a cause did Life come to death. Not without a cause did the Fountain of life, whence we drink in order that we may live, drink His cup which He was not bound to drink. For death was not Christ's due portion. As to the question whence death has come, let us look to our origin. Sin is death's parent. Had there been no sin, no one would have died. The first man received God's law, that is, God's commandment, on condition, that if he kept it he should live, if he violated it he should die. By not believing that he would die, he did what caused him to die; and found that to have been true which the Giver of the law had affirmed. Thence came death, thence man became mortal, thence came labor, thence misery, thence the second death after the first, that is, after temporal death, death everlasting. This tradition of death,

this law of destruction, binds every man who is born, except that one Man who became Man that man should not perish. For He came bound by no law of death; therefore He is called in the Psalm, "Free among the dead;" whom in all purity a Virgin conceived; whom she as a Virgin bore, and remained a Virgin; who lived without sin, who did not die because of sin; sharing in our penalty, not in our offence. Death is the penalty of offence; our Lord Jesus Christ came to die, did not come to sin; by sharing in our penalty without our offence, He annulled both our offence and penalty. What penalty? That which was due to us after this life. So He was crucified, that on the Cross He might show the dying-out of our old man; and He rose, that in His own life He might show our new life.

La Gloria Eterna de la Pascua

En este valle de lágrimas llevamos vidas afligidas de pecado y siempre bajo la sombra de la muerte. Cristo vino a liberarnos de las cadenas del pecado y probó que la muerte no es el fin, sino solamente el principio de la eternidad. Mi mamá murió hace treinta años en un domingo de Pascua en 1984. Debido a la Pascua sé que la veré de nuevo, al igual que a mi hijo que murió el año pasado en Pentecostés. Sin esperanza ni amor solo somos pobres creaturas. La Pascua nos da esperanza y no dice que somos hijos de un Dios amoroso. San Agustín nos recuerda estas gran verdades:

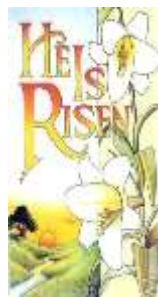
La Resurrección de nuestro Señor Jesús es la nueva vida de los que creen en Jesús; y este es el misterio de Su Pasión y Resurrección, que ustedes tienen que saben muy bien y lo deben cumplir por medio de sus acciones. Pues no sin ninguna causa vino la muerte a la vida. No sin causa la Fuente de vida, de la cual bebemos para poder vivir, beber de la copa que de la cual él no estaba obligado a beber. Pues la muerte no era la porción de Cristo. Y la pregunta es de donde llego la muerte, miremos a nuestro origen. El pecado es el padre de la muerte. Si no hubiera habido pecado, nadie moriría. El primer hombre recibió la ley de Dios, esto es, los mandamientos de Dios, con una condición, si él los cumpliera él viviría; si él los violaba él moriría. Al no creer que moriría, él hizo lo que le causó la muerte, y se dio cuenta que lo él Dador de la ley dijo era cierto. Por lo tanto, la muerte vino. De esa manera el hombre se hizo mortal, de aquí vino el trabajo, la miseria, luego la segunda muerte después de la primera, esto es, después de la muerte temporal, vino la muerte eterna. Esta tradición de la muerte, la ley de la destrucción, se aplica a cada hombre que nace, excepto al Hombre que se hizo hombre para que el hombre no pereciera. Pues él no vino atado a la ley del pecado; por eso a Él se le llama en el Salmo "libre de entre los muertos;" quien por la pureza de una virgen fue concebido, y que permaneció virgen después de haber sido concebido; quien vivió sin pecado, quien no murió debido al pecado, compartiendo nuestra penalidad, ni nuestras ofensas. La muerte es el castigo por las ofensas; nuestro Señor Jesucristo vino a morir, no vino a pecar; al compartir nuestro castigo sin nuestras ofensas, Él anuló tanto nuestras ofensas así como también nuestro castigo. ¿Qué castigo? El que se debe por nosotros después de la vida. Así es que Él fue crucificado, para que en la cruz él mostrara la muerte del hombre viejo; y el resucitado, para que en su propia vida Él nos muestre una nueva vida.
