From the President, Mike Maloney

Our 30th Anniversary New London to New Brighton Antique Car Run was a great success. It's hard for me to believe that 30 years have passed since the first Run.

I would like to thank all the participants in this truly international event. Also a big thank you to the hundreds of volunteers and contributors as well. Thank you to all the communities providing refreshments and entertainment at the stops along the way.

As you can tell, this event is a massive job to

organize, and I want to recognize our hard working Board of Directors for the duties they perform. I feel very fortunate to have such a fine group to work with.

Over 80 cars one hundred years or older participated in this event, including the pre-tour vehicles. We had 75 registered for the grand tour and 7 registered for the pre-tours. Sixty-seven cars started on Saturday, August 13th, and 59 completed the approximately 120-mile run. The weather was

perfect which adds to any event.

As usual Ed Walhof did a terrific job organizing the meals and pre-tours. Pre-tours included a dairy operation that milks 7,500 cows per day on a carousel that holds 106 cows at one time, and runs 22 hours a day (two hours downtime for cleanup). We also visited a 3,000 acre farm and
