

Those who humble themselves...

The wise teacher of Ecclesiasticus says: "...for great though the Lord is, by the humble he is glorified'. Humility is an attitude of the heart, a way of being. The word comes from 'humus' meaning ground or earth. In the second creation story, we are reminded that we are of the earth and that we will return to the earth. God breathes life into the humans and places them in a living garden to live, to share and to care for.

To be humble is to be grounded, to have one's feet on the ground and to be able to respect, not belittle the strengths and weaknesses of others. For we are made in the image of the One God. To be humble is to welcome and share the gifts one has, all the while acknowledging the One who gave them. But to belittle, to insult or mistreat others or creation as a whole is to insult, belittle and mistreat our source of life – the One 'who made them."

Shared meals played an important role in the society in which Jesus lived. More than just time for sharing nourishment, they were times to share ideas, to discover different aspects of relationships, to listen and to be heard. They were about sharing life, hospitality, hopes and needs with each other. On the other hand, they were often occasions for exclusion and discrimination of others. The place allocated could be a recognition of that person's importance or insignificance to the host.

In the Gospel parable of today, Jesus calls out and challenges cultural norms concerning power, strength and privilege. He exalts the role of the humble host, over the haughty householder

This year's Social Justice Statement highlights the damaging ways in which long embedded structures and culture can function as drivers and enablers of family and domestic violence. The gospel alerts us to the hidden ways in which power can blind us to the plight of our brothers and sisters most in need and yet most needed. The Statement is addressed to each member of our community that we may with humility, and openness of heart recognize and confront violence and abuse wherever they occur — beginning in our own family and friendship circles.

We are all part of One God's creation and must care for each other as a loving parent would humbly share and care for each of his /her children, according to their strengths and needs. It is about Respect – about giving not demanding.

As we approach the end of our lives, the essentials of life that we hold most dear become definitively clear to us. Our whole life appears like a seed that will have to be buried so that its flower and its fruit can be born.

Sacred Heart holds the care, safety and wellbeing of children, youth and vulnerable adults as a fundamental responsibility of the Church.

Our common commitment is drawn from the teaching and mission of Jesus with love and Justice and the dignity and sanctity of each human person at the heart of the Gospel. It is the policy of the Archdiocese that all clergy, employees and volunteers over the age of 18 must maintain current Working with Children Check (WWCC) throughout their involvement in parishes as in other agencies: all are to attend a safeguarding essentials module and updates organised by the Parish or Professional Standards online: and all are asked to sign a Declaration to abide by the parish Code of Conduct. These requirements of volunteers are just one -but an essential part of our united commitment to creating and maintaining a culturally safe environment for the young and the vulnerable in which they feel safe, heard and respected.



This year's Social Justice Statement, Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse, invites us to engage with a complex and confronting social reality. It explores the roots of violence and abuse, honours the voices of victims, offers a social and theological exploration of the reality of violence, especially against women and children, and invites us to develop relationships in all parts of our lives 'marked by equality and reciprocity rather than domination and violence, respect and freedom rather than coercion and control.' We welcome this urgent call from our Church to deepen our faith through full and frank discussion and dialogue, advocacy and action.

POINT NUMBER 3 * A warning message ahead the COPs Ahead COP 27 on climate (Egypt, November 2022) and COP 15 on biodiversity (Canada, December 2022) Pope Francis recalls in his message the importance of "promoting the effective implementation of the Paris Agreement", as recently ratified by the Holy See.

"Each passing moment is an opportunity for everyone, especially world leaders, to reverse the biodiversity and climate crises. Let COP 27 bring forth ambitious commitments to prevent carbon emissions from fossil fuels and support for clean energy transition as well as efficient relief for our brothers and sisters already within the climate crisis. Let COP 15 bring forth a firm commitment to end any more biodiversity collapse", said Lindlyn Moma, Advocacy Director of the Laudato Si' Movement. And to the community of Catholics, the Pope calls them to prayer: "In this Season of Creation, let us pray that COP27 and COP15 may unite the human family to decisively address the double crisis of climate and biodiversity reduction".

52 Ways to help the environment (cont'd) 42. Do not sin by wasting food

Avoid food waste with good habits and smart shopping. At the table, take only what you are going to eat. Look for solidarity networks and apps that help share the leftovers of each day. Learn to use leftovers with creative dishes. Do not buy more than necessary and make better use of the pantry. As Pope Francis said, "Let us remember well, however, that whenever food is thrown out it is as if it were stolen from the table of the poor, from the hungry! I ask everyone to reflect on the problem of the loss and waste of food, to identify ways and approaches which, by seriously dealing with this problem, convey solidarity and sharing with the underprivileged." We pray to our loving God for the people in Asia this week who are suffering floods from exceptional monsoon rains, glacial melt, and mudslides. Please help us to be generous to those who have lost loved ones, homes, livestock, crops, and future happiness. Amen

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come

and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
