

The public is invited. Classes are for ages 4-16.


St. Paul's Lutheran Church July 8-12

Strasburg Lions "LEO" Club


On April 18, some of the Strasburg Lions "LEO" club members gave up a

day of their spring break to travel to Springfield to volunteer at the Mary Bryant Home for the Blind.




Village inducts new officials

others projects.




