It is with heavy hearts and deep sadness that we announce the passing of Layne M. Roberts on June 18th 2022 at McLaren Bay Region Hospital, in Bay City Michigan with his loved ones by his side. On October 27, 1967 Layne was born to Richard and Diane (Capling) Roberts in Harbor Beach Michigan. He was the eldest of five siblings. Layne was intelligent, kind hearted, handsome, had a beautiful smile, and was blessed with many talents, one of which was music. Layne learned to play the ukulele at the age of six, and later learned to play the guitar, piano, accordion, and harmonica, he especially loved the guitar.
