

Thanks to Crescent Hills resident Bob Shaner, a retired carpenter and construction supervisor, the old outhouse, unused for 2-3 years, was converted into a storage building. We hired Bob after he presented his plan that avoided having to move four tons of limestone, which plan was stalling the project. Instead he removed the wall separating the men and women's room, the toilet bench, and both doors, crushed the cement blocks and dumped them into the toilet well, and filled it with cement. He power washed and painted inside and out, sealed off one door and installed another solid core door. He boarded up the eaves to prevent birds and bees from entering, installed shelves and vents. He donated the paint and some of the hardware for the doors and purchased supplies with his veteran's 10% Home Depot discount. This project was completed in one week. Ed and Jan are considering putting a car in their garage space that, until now, held all the park supplies. All of this and within the planned budget. Thank you Bob. You've made a lot of folks happy.

PENN HILLS IS A TREE CITY USA



Even though the official announcement of Penn Hills becoming a "Tree City USA" was in April, we did not officially tell the Penn Hills Tree Commission, and its head Kathy Raborn, how proud we are of this achievement. The Commission has been in existence since 2017. Since then it has planted 136 trees by as many volunteers throughout neighborhoods (including Springdale Drive), community parks and

SCHOOL BUS STOP MEAL PICK UP IN PENN HILLS

Starting July 1st - 11:00-1:00 Every Monday, Wednesday & Friday

Through a collaborative partnership spanning government, nonprofit, and local business, food delivery bus routes have been developed throughout the Penn Hills community to ensure children, families, and seniors can receive meals at convenient locations during this difficult and uncertain time. Partners include the United Way of Southwestern PA, Eat'n Park, A Second Chance Inc, Carnegie Mellon University, Allegheny County Department of Human Services, Penn Hills School District, Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, the Municipality of Penn Hills, Allies for Children, Penn Hills Clergy Association, and other community organizations. Generously funded through the United Way's Students and Families Food Relief Fund, this model has the capacity to serve an additional 1,000 meals per day.

Beginning on July 1st, ACCESS vehicles will deliver food to Penn Hills residents along five bus routes. The stops are strategically placed to ensure residents are able to access the food they need. Communications alerting residents to the bus routes will be conducted through community organizations, municipal channels, and the school district. By launching this model, Penn Hills is leading the way for other communities, as this innovation is now being replicated in additional municipalities with significant need. The United Way's Students and Families Food Relief Fund has already served over 250,000 meals since the end of March. With this newfound collaboration and innovative delivery model, capacity to feed more families is expected to grow.


