- 3. How are they praying? What terms are used? How is God addressed? How is God described? Praised?
- 4. What is the purpose of the prayer? What is the main subject or request of the prayer?
- 5. What personal "feelings" are exposed?
- 6. What evidence of God's answering this prayer is evident from the context of Scripture?

PERSONAL APPLICATIONS

- 1. How can I express this in my own words to God at this time in my life?
- 2. How can I relate to this prayer past, present, or future? How can I identify with what's been prayed?
- 3. What basic phrases, words, concepts used in this particular prayer give me insight as to how I can pray?
