5. 1 CORINTHIANS 4:18–21 seems to suggest that *gentleness* is not always the right response to certain situations. What can you learn from this passage?

6. Bible Commentator Matthew Henry made the observation that *sometimes the unkindness of our friends is a greater trial of our meekness than the malice of our enemies.* Why might this be true?
