INVITATIONS MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

It's hard going someplace new, isn't it? You feel out of place. You aren't sure what to do. It's seems that everybody else is "in the know" and you are...NOT! That is a staple of human nature AND the primary reason so many people aren't terribly willing to try new things- they don't like that feeling of "not belonging".

And if that is true ANYWHERE, it's true in a church. Even in the most welcoming of congregations (I'm looking at YOU, Aledo UMC!), visitors are pretty unwilling to muster the courage necessary to step into a new place and be vulnerable.

You might be thinking just now, "That's not really true, Pastor! We went to a church in Florida while we were on vacation. We didn't know anybody and we had NO problem just walking in and introducing ourselves!" First off- well done! But, you have to remember- you're "church people". You may not know THAT church, but you know CHURCH. And while we certainly welcome anybody who walks in our doors, we are especially reaching out to those people who aren't "church people"- we exist to CONNECT people to Jesus Christ!

So maybe you know someone who has been a "church person" but has drifted from church...for any number of reasons. (And frankly, the reason really shouldn't matter to anyone but them!) Or maybe you know someone who has been saying for some time, "I really ought to go to church." Or maybe you know someone who is facing a major life change- death in the family, devastating diagnosis, new baby, wedding, divorce, whatever. (Statistics show that the majority of people who start going to church do so because of a major life change.)

Regardless of which of those types of folks you know (And it's probably all three!), they are one invitation away from actually coming to church. The odds of them coming on their own are fairly small. But the odds of them coming if YOU invite them increase dramatically.

Why should we invite people? If the goal is simply more "seats in the seats" and therefore more money in the plate, then we are missing the mark. But if the goal is what is stated on the wall in the sanctuary, the bulletin, the website- "We exist to connect people to Jesus Christ"- then the more the merrier!

Churches don't grow through snappy ad campaigns and TV commercials. They grow through one person inviting one person. That's where YOU come in. Invite people. Seek them out. Tell them about your church. Invite them to try us out. Tell them you'll meet them here. Better- offer to bring them. Sit with them. Introduce them. Show them around. Follow up.

If I do those things, they have a small impact. If we ALL do those thingsthere is no telling where God might lead us!

CURRENT & NEW SERMON SERIES

On Sunday, March 5th, we began a new journey- <u>Creed!</u> We are spending the 7 weeks leading to Easter walking through one of the foundational pieces of the Christian faith- The Apostle's Creed. First appearing around 710AD, this statement of belief in many ways encapsulates what Christians believe. The remaining weeks of the series look like this:

April 2, 2017- Paraclete

"I believe in the Holy Spirit"

(Ezekiel 36:26-27, Acts 2:38-39)

April 9, 2017- Body

"the holy catholic church, the communion of saints"

(Exodus 20:12, 1Peter 2:9-10)

April 16, 2017- Savior

"the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen." (Habakkuk 3:18-19, Acts 4:12)

Then, on Sunday, April 23, we begin a new and relatively short walk- 4 Sundays- through the post-resurrection (that is to say AFTER Easter) appearances of Jesus called <u>Closing Night Strike</u>. We won't talk about ALL of His appearances, but we will get an overview of what happened after Easter morning and before Jesus ascended into Heaven. Each week will have a song tied to it – in fact it's the name of the message – that is related to the story we'll look at that week. The weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, April 23- The Long and Winding Road (John 20:24-29)

What do you do when your belief isn't enough?

(Psalm 31:21-24, James 4:4-8)

Sunday, April 30- Still Haven't Found What I'm Looking For (Luke 24:13-18, 27-32)

Would YOU know Him if you met Him on the road?

(2Chronicles 15:2b-4, Ephesians 1:16-19)

Sunday, May 7- I Can't Fight This Feeling Any More (John 21:15-22)

There comes a point when surrender is the only option.

(Psalm 73:24-26, Matthew 22:37-40)

Sunday, May 14- Don't Stop Believing (Matthew 28:16-20)

Jesus (and Mom) gives us guidelines on how to live life.

(John 12:24-26, John 20:19-23)

Come each week expecting God to show up in powerful ways!

The Trinity: Practically Speaking

WHAT: Rev. Mark's current Tuesday morning Bible Study

WHY: Three Gods, or One, or Three-in-One? Since the word Trinity does not appear in the Bible, many people wonder whether the doctrine is anything more than an intellectual puzzle created by theologians. CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

Bishop Gregory Palmer, the former Bishop of our Illinois Great Rivers Conference of the United Methodist Church, in an e-letter dated December 20, 2008, said this about the decline of our denomination, "...the invitation to discipleship is at the core of our identity and mission as The United Methodist Church. We as an annual conference...have struggled to be invitational...with the gospel of Jesus Christ. In 2007, 60 percent of our congregations received ZERO persons by professions of faith. We are simply not bringing new people into the life of the church in a way that outpaces our decline. As Bishop of the Illinois Area, I want to encourage you that, as United Methodists, we have a glorious heritage of proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ and offering invitation to the transforming relationship with the Savior."

6 out of every 10 United Methodist Churches in our conference are losing ground. This makes AUMC all the more exciting of a place in which to do ministry! New members are joining. Baptisms are happening. If THAT doesn't get you excited...then your wood's all wet!

Have you felt God tugging at you, urging you to take a leap of faith and become a larger part of something bigger than yourself? 

ELECTRONIC (ONLINE) GIVING

I've noticed lately that we have a lot more members and friends giving electronically. When you talk to them about their experience with electronic giving they are really excited because it is so convenient. They don't have to remember to write a check each week/month. They set up the amount to be deducted from their account and it just happens! We actually receive money electronically from two sources – bank billpay and PayPal. Most banks currently offer free billpay services. We currently have 15 giving units that are contributing to our church with billpay. Three are giving weekly, two are giving twice monthly and 10 are giving monthly. These electronic payments total approximately \$4,000 per month. If you would rather use PayPal you can set up a regular payment on the church website. If you go to our home page (www.myaledoumc.com) and choose "giving" from the Navigation Bar near the top, it will take you to a page that will provide the opportunity for you to give electronically. You can either do a one-time gift

or a recurring monthly gift. We are currently receiving 3 monthly PayPal contributions totaling \$316 per month. On an annual basis we are receiving electronic contributions totaling \$52,000 per year. This has been good for the church cash flow and as the person who is paying the church bills I really appreciate a stable cash flow. Electronic giving is good for the church, easy for the members and dependable. Won't you consider electronic giving? *Dwight Reynolds, Treasurer*
