
In 1973, with the foundation of THE SHERLOCK HOLMES ENTHUSIASTIC READERS' LEAGUE ON CRIMINAL KNOWLEDGE, or SHERLOCK, at Wright State University, by Professors Martin Arbagi and John Zamonski of the History and English Departments, respectively, and James Newton, an undergraduate who is now Professor of Economics at Capitol University in Columbus. The three were soon joined by Alvin Rodin, M.D., of the newly—created WSU School of Medicine, and Ritchie Thomas, Director of the University Library. The group's name was changed to the more canonical DARLINGTON SUBSTITUTES. In 1976, a companion Holmesian Club, THE RETIRED COLOURMEN, formed at the University of Dayton.

It was Al Rodin who first proposed the "Holmes/Doyle Symposium," a conference on both Sherlock Holmes and Arthur Conan Doyle, M.D. Himself a medical doctor, Al had a longstanding interest in physicians who were also writers, for example, Anton Chekov, Somerset Maugham, or Walker Percy (not to mention John Watson). The first Symposium was held in November 1981 under the joint sponsorship of Wright State and nearby Central State Universities, and it became an annual event. After Al's retirement and death, the Symposium was directed by Cathy Gill and Greg Sullivan, and eventually, by Cathy Gill alone.

Like most schools, both UD and WSU understandably restricted membership in campus clubs to students, faculty, staff, and alumnæ or alumni. Thus, there was no Holmesian club for the general public in the Dayton Metropolitan Area. Accordingly, THE AGRA TREASURERS was formed in the fall of 1992 by **Don** and **Chris Robertson.** Contrary to popular belief, the Treasurers had nothing to do with the Symposium except to host the traditional Friday evening Welcome Receptions through the decades.

In 2013, Cathy retired due to poor health. There was no Symposium that year, but in 2014, rebranded as "Holmes, Doyle, & Friends," the conference has revived, now at last fully under the sponsorship of THE AGRA TREASURERS.
