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

Higher Education

There are still 6 state approved licensure programs for ECSE- MN State, Mankato; MN State, Moorhead; MN State, Southwest, St Cloud State University; University of MN Duluth; University of MN Twin Cities; and University of St Thomas. Many of our programs are currently being reviewed by the state licensing board for renewal.

Two areas that are most pressing for institutions of higher education (IHE) are updates to licensure rules and the new tiered licensure system. During fiscal year 2020, the standards for early childhood special education will be reviewed and this will likely result in program changes. With the new tiered licensing system, IHEs are working to preserve the teaching profession. If you are not aware, one can obtain a tier 3 license without ever having completed a teacher education program and only needing to take a few courses. For a teacher to be highly effective and to ensure quality for the teaching profession one should seek and complete all necessary components for a tier 4 license.

Article Summary

Members of DEC receive the *Journal of Early Intervention* and the magazine *Young Exceptional Children*.

As a speech-language pathologist, my attention was drawn to the article, "Feedback for Dual Language Learners", Young Exceptional Children Volume 21 Number 4 December 2018, by Hyejin Park, PhD of Arizona State University, Gregory A. Cheatham, PhD of University of Kansas and Margarita Jimenez-Silva, EdD of Arizona State University. The article describes seven strategies Recasting, Clarification requests, Clarification, Elicitation, Direct feedback, Paralinguistic Cue and Translation. Teams should target specific language objectives the IEP team has determined are priority. When facilitating language growth in inclusive environments, others need to be involved in order to provide numerous opportunities to work on specific IEP language objectives throughout the day. The article gives examples of when and how to elicit opportunities both in education environments and in home environments. Uniquely, it gives examples of how caregivers may provide feedback for the target skills in the home environment. In order to effectively give numerous opportunities, adults must observe, listen and be ready to implement a feedback strategy specific to the target skill.
