**OPERATION OF SKATEBOARDS, SCOOTERS AND ROLLER BLADES  
PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN AREAS**

**§15-501. Definition.**

The term "skateboard" shall be defined as a platform mounted on roller-skate-type wheels and propelled or ridden by an individual or individuals as well as any similar vehicle or contraption. Scooters and roller blades are also included in this definition. The use of bicycles is regulated by the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code.<sup>2</sup>

**§15-502. Operation of Skateboards Prohibited in Certain Areas.**

The operation riding of skateboards is hereby prohibited in the following streets or thoroughfares as well as the curbs and sidewalks bordering them and all public property and rights-of-way in the vicinity. Skateboard riding is prohibited after dusk.

Centre Street	North Borough line to the South Borough line
Thirteenth Street playground at Thirteenth Street	
Water Street	Maple Street to the South Borough line

## MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

### **§15-503. Penalty.**

Any person or persons violating the above-captioned prohibition shall be guilty of a summary offense and subject to a fine of \$25 for each offense. A third or subsequent offense shall carry a maximum fine of \$100 per offense. In addition to the imposition of fines and penalties, the authorities may order violators to cease and desist the offending conduct.
