

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

BLESSED IS THE KING

Today the disciples sing and shout as they enter Jerusalem, crying out with joy, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord" (Luke 19:38). But in just a few short



days the disciples will be silent and absent as Jesus is led away to Golgotha to be crucified under the inscription, "This is the King of the Jews" (Luke 23:38). Desolate and defeated, they do not find their voices until the Holy Spirit frees their tongues at Pentecost. But Jesus told the Pharisees that "if they keep si-

lent, the stones will cry out!" (Luke19:40). It gives us hope that during times of persecution, times of trial, even in the absence of voices, somehow the testimony of God's creation will bear witness.

The word of God is dynamic. It inspires action. Isaiah preaches that day after day God opens his ears, suggesting that there is freshness in God's word each day. Moreover, Isaiah is called to use God's word to rouse the people, to get them to act. God's word means to do more than inform or instruct, it is to drive people to act.

None of us can honestly say that we are worse off than Jesus was at His death. Emptied of all His divine privileges,

obedient to the will of God, humbling Himself as a slave, He accepted the abuse, the conviction, and the death sentence. He has been betrayed by one friend, denied by another, and abandoned by the rest. He has no possessions. All He had was the clothes on His back, and even



those are taken away. He is humiliated, disgraced, put to shame. He is all alone. No, He is not alone. He knows God has not abandoned Him. Nor are any of us alone. No matter how horrible our lot is, we are not alone.

Jesus has placed His trust in God and has surrendered to God's will, so throughout the narrative His concern is not with His own fate, but with those of others: His disciples, Peter, the high priest's servant, the women of Jerusalem, the penitent criminal. The word compassion literally means "to suffer with," and in the midst of His greatest suffering Jesus suffers with all these people He encounters on the path to His death. Even on the cross, hours from death, He shows compassion to the criminal who asks for mercy.




