
From the Pastor's Desk

Pastor Allegra Hoots

Dear Friends,

Greetings to you in the Holy name of our Lord Jesus Christ, our blessed Redeemer. I trust each of you is well and maintaining a Holy Lent, empowered by the Holy Spirit. As the Lenten season draws to a close, let us focus on the profound implications of the crucifixion and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, for individuals, the universal church, and the world.

The Gospel accounts of Jesus' trial, crucifixion, and death, alongside Isaiah 53, illuminate God's boundless and immeasura-



Jesus, the God-man who did no wrong, endured injustice at the hands of those he created to reunite humanity with himself. He fulfilled the biblical principle, "Without the shedding of blood, there is no remission of sin" (Hebrews 9:22).

On Good Friday, one of the most solemn days in the liturgical calendar, God's people intentionally recall Jesus' anguish. Whether worshiping alone or gathering with fellow believers, they shed tears of joy and thanksgiving for the reunion between Creator and creation, made possible by the precious blood of the Lamb of God, the Lord Jesus Christ. Simultaneously, they grieve for Jesus' agony, acknowledging that he suffered and died in their place.

In contrast, the exuberance of Resurrection Sunday, also called Easter Sunday, the most joyous day in the Christian calendar, surpasses even the festive celebration of Christmas. During Advent, the season leading up to Christmas, the church anticipates the birth of the King of Kings and the arrival of the conqueror and deliverer. The commemoration culminates on Christmas, with gift-giving symbolizing and serving as a reminder that Jesus Christ is God's greatest gift to the world. The Easter vigil that begins on Maundy Thursday, with Jesus' arrest, and concludes on Resurrection Sunday is a powerful reminder that the baby Jesus, God incarnate, became the suffering servant before being raised from the dead, then elevated to his rightful place at the right hand of God the Father (Mark 16:19, 1 Peter 3: 22-23).

Resurrection Sunday displays Jesus' omnipotence, as he conquered death by raising himself from the grave (1 Corinthians 15: 55-57). In the words and sentiments of a beloved hymn, his victory over death and the grave reassures us that we can face and overcome life's challenges because he lives. Furthermore, Resurrection Sunday reminds us that because of Jesus, we are liberated from sin's power and consequences and can experience eternal life—unending fellowship with God, our Creator.

Jesus' sacrificial death atoned for humanity's sins and displayed God's immense love. The resurrection demonstrates God's absolute power over all things, including death. Through both acts, we are set free, and whom the Son sets free is free indeed (John 8: 36). Glory hallelujah!



Palm Sunday

Catholic and Protestant communities celebrate Palm Sunday. (The Orthodox Christian community celebrates later as they follow the Julian calendar.) This marks the beginning of Holy Week, historically the most sacred time of year for Christians.

Palm Sunday recalls an event in the Christian Scripture (The New Testament) of Jesus entering into Jerusalem and being greeted by the people waving palm branches. For

Christians, it is a reminder of the welcoming of Jesus into our hearts and of our willingness to follow him.

The service on Palm Sunday also includes a reading of the Passion, that is, the story of the suffering and crucifixion of Jesus of Nazareth. In today's church, great care is given to make sure that the story of the death of Jesus is not presented in an anti-Semitic manner. Jesus' death is seen by Christians as salvation and as a reminder of how prophets are often killed when they stand for justice and peace.

Holy Thursday (sometimes referred to as Maundy Thursday after the Latin mandatum or command to love one another) is a day when Christians commemorate the Last Supper of Jesus. In some traditions, there is the washing of the feet of various members of the community to recall a gesture of Christ at the Last Supper when he washed the feet of his disciples. This is a sign of the need to do more to love one another and to serve all people, especially the poor.

Good Friday is a solemn day on which Christians recall the death of Jesus and its promise of hope and new life. In some traditions a wooden cross is set up and people spend time meditating before it.

Other people make the Stations of the Cross a devotion that recalls the journey of Jesus on the Via Dolorosa (Way of Sorrows) in Jerusalem to Calvary where he was crucified. (In Jerusalem the place of Christ's death and resurrection is commemorated inside the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.)

Many Christians keep this devotion but also see in the suffering of Jesus a reminder to be more concerned for the suffering of people in today's world. For many Christians, this day is also a day of fasting and penance.

Easter

Easter Sunday is the greatest feast in the Christian calendar. While our society puts a major emphasis on Christmas, no other day is traditionally as sacred for the Christian community as Easter. This is the day Christians commemorate the resurrection of Christ.



In some traditions, the services begin the night before with the lighting of a new fire and the blessing of a large Easter candle. Water is blessed and many are baptized. But for all Christians, this is a day to renew one's faith.

In the Catholic Church, there is a sprinkling of all people with the newly blessed Easter water as a sign of renewal of our baptismal commitment. In many Protestant communities, Easter is celebrated at a sunrise service early on Easter morning.



ARBOR DAY-April 28, 2023

Why are trees so vital to our lives? They prevent erosion, provide oxygen-rich air, and they give shade from the hot sun. These are just a few of the many reasons why we celebrate Arbor Day.

Arbor Day—which literally translates to "tree" day from the Latin origin of the word *arbor*—is a holiday that celebrates the planting, upkeep and preservation of trees. For centuries, communities spanning the globe have found various ways to honor nature and the environment. However, the appreciation of trees and forests in modern times can be largely attributed to Arbor Day. And although Arbor Day may not have the same clout as holidays like Valentine's Day or St. Patrick's Day (or even Earth Day), it has a history with strong roots that branched out across multiple nations. Arbor Day 2023 will occur on Friday, April 28, and is typically celebrated on the last Friday in April in the United States.

Throughout this experience, I felt a deep connection to God, who provided the strength I needed. My friends, family, and professors were astonished. I could only say, "God gave me the strength."



CHILDREN'S CORNER

Parents, please read this to your younger child(ren)





Theme: Palm Sunday

Object: Flags, confetti, noise makers, etc.

Scripture: Matthew 21:1-11

Hand each child a flag or noise maker to use when you give them the cue in the lesson.

I want you to imagine this morning that we are going to have a visit from the president. I have some flags for some of you to wave and I have some noise makers. I will describe the parade, and as the president passes by, I want you to wave, blow your horns, and shout. Are you ready? The parade is about to begin.

Look! The parade is approaching. I can see it in the distance. The band is leading the parade and behind the band there are cars with other important people like our representatives, our senator, and the mayor of our city. As they pass by, we smile and wave. (Pause for kids to respond.)

Then, here he comes -- the president. He is riding down the street in a big black convertible. He waves to the crowds that are lining the streets as he passes by. The people are...

waving flags (Pause for kids to respond.)

blowing their noise makers and shouting, "Yea! Hip! Hip! Hooray! Yea!" (Pause for kids to respond.)

Then as the parade moves on down the street, the sound of the band playing and people shouting fades away in the distance. It is over. The celebration is over.

That was very much like a scene that took place in Jerusalem one day. King Jesus was coming to their city. People lined the streets. Some people walked in front of the king and some walked behind him. Instead of a big, black convertible, the King rode on the back of a small donkey. Let's do what the people did when King Jesus came to town.

As he rode through the streets of the city, the crowds...

waved palm branches (Pause for kids to respond with their flags.)

they shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" (Pause for kids to respond.)

they shouted, "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Pause for kids to respond.)

they shouted, "Hosanna in the highest heaven!" (Pause for kids to respond.)

Today is Palm Sunday. Today we celebrate the entry of King Jesus into Jerusalem. It was a day that marked the beginning of an incredible week. A week that would see Jesus cheered, then arrested, tried, condemned, and crucified. But as that week came to an end, another week began just as the previous week had begun...with a celebration.

PRAYER

Dear Jesus, our voices join with the voices of the people in Jerusalem some 2,000 years ago. Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. In Jesus' name, amen.


