

Do not fear, for I am with you, do not be afraid, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my victorious right hand. Isaiah 41:10

With all wisdom and insight ⁹he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth <u>in Christ</u>, ¹⁰as a <u>plan</u> for the fullness of time, to gather up all things <u>in him</u>, things in heaven and things on earth. Ephesians 1:9-10

We used to have a saying in the military. *No matter how good the plan and how prepared you are... expect it to last 2 seconds when the battle starts*. When the bullets are flying and the dust is kicked up – your communications are down, and your senses are compromised – this saying is very true. Your fear kicks in, selfpreservation and "fight or flight" compels; however, the army has a plan for everything which is referred to as the *"standard operating procedure" (s.o.p.)*. When in an open field as a nuclear device goes off in the distance, an S.O.P. kicks in and you cover yourself with a poncho, get low to the ground and face your helmet towards the blast. Every soldier listens for their squad leader to bark out the order, or whoever is left in charge to know what to do. I think about such plans and procedures as necessary because it helps those in harm's way to manage their fear. To know the plan is to have some feeling of control over outcomes. This sounds good, doesn't it? When faced with daily life battles and struggles, like cancer, grief, divorce, economic trials, job loss, and such, we have an S.O.P. but it might not be what you expect. You see, we can trust in a plan, however no matter how good the plan – we can't control people, or many other external variables, and there are always elements of the plan that we do not or cannot know. We can be optimistic about a situation and put a responsive spin on it but that is not always possible or helpful to the reality of the situation, or others who do not perceive it that way.

For Christians, the S.O.P. is not about what we do, or plan, or how we respond to a situation. We are called to put our faith and hope into God. It's not the trust in the plan that matters, but the leader who moves with you through it and makes the decisions in the moment when plans must change. God tells us repeatedly not to fear because God is faithful and trustworthy, and God's got your back. Trust in God with everything and in everything. When God seems far off and aloof, trust more fiercely! If you believe that God will not understand, then remember that God came down as a baby and died on the cross...Yes, God has been in it with us, and God brings us through all of it. Trust God! Amen.



The goal of foster care is to reunite children with the parents when possible. The foster family can play an integral part in making that happen, often becoming mentors to the birth parents, helping them learn parenting skills they may not have had modeled to them.

An LSI provider told me about a picture she had recently received. Imagine, if you would, a photo of two women, one on each end of a bench, and four kids with them. All happy. All smiling. It looks like they were enjoying a beautiful day in the park.

On the left is the birth mother of those kids. She will be the first to admit, things haven't been easy – but she loves these kids.

The other woman is the foster mother. She loves these kids too. Two of the kids were adopted by the foster family, one lives with the birth mom, and the foster child on the mother's lap was soon to be reunited with the birth mom. They are celebrating Mother's Day together.

Foster families provide more than a safe place for children to land. This foster/adoptive parent is a wonderful mentor for this birth mom!
