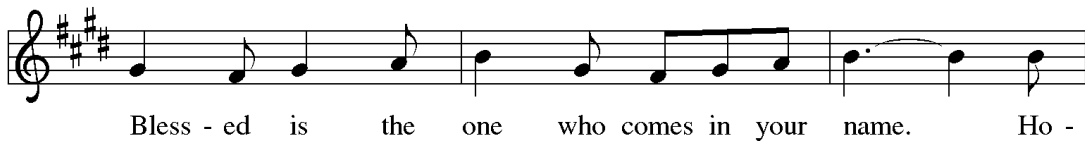
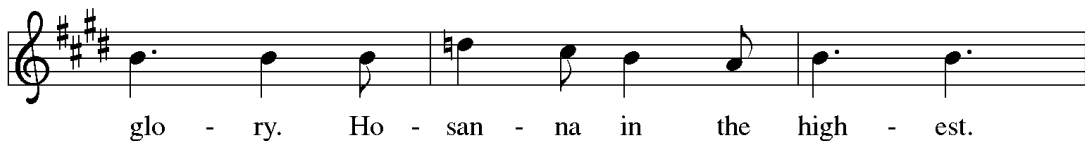
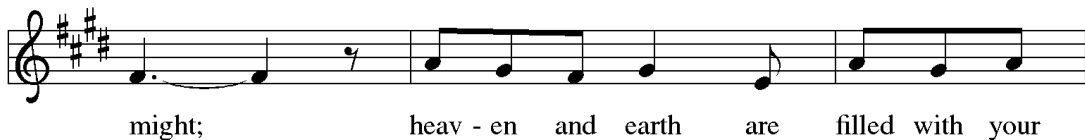
PREFACE
