I love church traditions. Some are a bit silly, like the unassigned "assigned" pews we sit in on Sunday morning. I don't know about you, but when I discover someone sitting in "my" pew, I might go sit in another seat, but I grumble a bit as I do it. Some church traditions have a lot more meaning, like the ways we celebrate baptisms and weddings and funerals points towards our Presbyterian faith and how we understand that faith. Each church I've been to does something a little different, whether it's the doxology they sing or the prayers they pray, each church puts a spin on the way they do things.

One of the things that doesn't really change however are the holy days celebrated by our church. Forty days after Easter, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, and 10 days after that, we celebrate Pentecost, the day the Holy Spirit came on the apostles. One of the church traditions we participate in is that we wear red.

Now, some fun facts about the color red. It's my favorite color, first of all! Second, it's a primary color, meaning it's not made up of any other colors. In the Hebrew language, the words for "human" and "red" and "blood" all have similar origins, and the color red is often associated with fire, which is also a prominent biblical symbol.

We wear red on Pentecost as an outward sign of inward transformation by the Holy Spirit. As "tongues of fire" came to rest on these disciples on that first Pentecost long ago, we gather together and then leave still blazing with the fire of hope God offers all through God's Spirit. The red is a sign that the good news of Jesus came to all who were there in a language they could understand from people with whom they would not otherwise have communicated.

Therefore, take this as an invitation: to wear red on May 28th. On that day, we will also celebrate New Member Sunday, welcoming several new members and baptizing others. You are invited into this body of Christ and also into proclaiming the reality of grace, hope, and salvation in Jesus.

#### HAPPY BIRTHDAY 160 years 1863 - 2023

**Brick & Mortar to Celebrate** 

The church is the body of Christ-all the people who accept Christ's gift of salvation and follow Christ's teachings. A church is much more than a

building. However, 160 years ago the congregation of the First Presbyterian Church constructed a building in order to worship together. That first church was a

large, frame structure - "the largest and best sanctuary in the area." In addition to church activities, school functions, as well as community social events, were held there. The original manse was constructed in those early days as well. Though remodeled and added on to several times, our church is the oldest in Mineral





In 1948 a major renovation of the old structure was undertaken. The project took almost 6 months and the building was dedicated on Sunday, March 27, 1949. The entire building was brick veneered and the windows and steeple were replaced. The sanctuary was also completely remodeled. The Pulpit, Lectern, Communion Table, Baptismal Font, and Pulpit Chairs are still in use today.

The project cost approximately \$30,000 and was paid for by 67 families in three years. "With faith, prayer, and liberal gifts from our members, the church was rededicated debt-free."



The next construction project was the new manse. The old manse was torn down in 1955 and the present one built in 1956.


The cornerstone for the Education Wing was laid in 1960. This two-story addition to the rear of the church included a ladies' parlor, six new classrooms, a pastor's study, an enlarged kitchen, and a new heating system.





In 1989, the Front Entrance was redesigned and the elevator installed to make our building handicapped accessible. The steeple was replaced in this renovation also; however, the one we see today was replaced after a wind storm several

years later (the fourth steeple, if I count correctly!) The new concrete floor was poured in Fellowship Hall and the old bathrooms removed. The addition of a new unisex restroom and small classroom were also part of this project.



FPCMR has gone through many physical changes but what remains unchanged is our steadfast faith in God and our "spiritual foundation of faith in Jesus Christ."
