The fire would lead to a seven year closure. It took 350 firefighters and 60 fire fighting companies, and all the others professions needed for this large a fire. Because of the original plan of the library the amount of volumes had more then doubled in size, therefore it, along with the concrete walls, made it hard or impossible to get around corners to fight the fire.

The heat was so intense that the personnel fighting the fire had to be relieved every five to fifteen minutes. The floors were so hot that when water was applied to cool the area, the water would actually boil.

400,000 volumes (20% of the books) were destroyed, on the other hand 85% of the building and it's contents were saved. Most importantly no one was killed.

There was an immediate call for help to the public to clean and box up books and other items which were then taken to an unpublished place to freeze dry them within 48 hours to prevent mold from growing on the books.

In October of 1993 the library was reopened and now a book is out called *The Library Book* by Susan Orleans.

To this day no was has been convicted for starting the fire and how exactly the fire started has not been determined.

The reason why I am writing about this is because you know from my ramblings how I have been reading all sorts of books.

I had just finished some trivia on Will Rogers and then, for some reason found a book on courtship. After that I found a book called *Little Faith* which was a novel about older parents whose daughter decides to join a religious cult in Wisconsin. The author id from the lowa Writer's Workshop.

This led back to a book I borrowed from Robert Brost, about Theodore Roosevelt's journey down one of the Amazon's tributaries (*The River of Doubt*).

Now do you understand how my mind works? Poor Charlemagne has sort of a hearing problem (or so he claims). I think it has come from 49 years of him trying to follow my train of thought.

It's sort of ridiculous in a way because when it comes to numbers I have to have everything organized. If you don't believe me watch me in the selves of the library and then pray for patience.
