



Make plans now to come out on Monday, July 4<sup>th</sup>, and join the neighborhood's celebration of the 246th anniversary of our nation's founding. The annual Patriotic Parade is a fun family event for all ages. Connie Inmon of Next Home Realty has sponsored a photo booth once again this year, so don't forget to take some fun pics of you and your friends. The HOA has provided some much needed ice cream following the parade. After the awards the Lakewood Residents Club will host Open House, so stick around and take a dip in the pool.

Registration opens at 8:45 am the day of the parade on the pool deck at the LRC clubhouse for the walkers, bike riders, and wagon pullers/riders. If you are in a decorated vehicle or are pulling a float, we will have curbside Registration for you. All vehicles and floats will need to line up on Lakeview Place (the street running next to LRC that leads to The Woods Private School). The Parade starts at 9:30 am from the Lakewood Forest Residents' Club, 15006 Lakewood Forest Drive. All are welcome to participate in the Parade, but only those who register are eligible to be judged for their costumes and decorations. There are seven categories for judging (see below) plus the overall top male and female awards. The Parade will return to the LRC where we will gather in the pool area for post-Parade activities. These include cooling down with ice-cold bottled water, ice cream, and the presentation of awards and trophies. The LRC pool will be open for all at no charge for the day, so bring or wear your bathing suit and take the LRC plunge.

#### Parade Route (see map)

At 9:30 am the parade will be led by our Constables and the Cypress Creek Fire Department. The route starts at the LRC clubhouse and goes in clockwise fashion as follows - South on Lakewood Forest Drive to Park River Drive, left on Park River to

Lakewood Forest, right on Lakewood Forest to Normont Drive, right on Normont to Tupperglen Drive, right on Tupperglen to Sandy Creek Drive, right on Sandy Creek and follow the curve to Park River, left on Park River to Lakewood Forest, and left on Lakewood Forest back to the LRC and into the pool area through the pool gate. If you live along the parade route, or on Lakeview Place, kindly remove any vehicles parkedalong the curb that Saturday morning until after the Parade. We will send out a postcard reminder to the affected houses several days prior. The parade route will be lined with American flags the day before the Parade so keeping your yard watered helps a lot with the flag setting. Thank you for your cooperation! Participation and Judging Kids, parents, grandparents, grandkids, and pets - all are welcome to participate. Also invited are Scout troops, clubs, teams, and other organized (or disorganized!) groups. Walkers, bike riders, wagon riders, decorated cars and floats, antique & classic cars can join us for a fun parade through the neighborhood. Decorate those bikes and wagons and vehicles, plan a Patriotic costume, or just wear red, white and blue. It's up to you. The 3 best entries in each category will receive ribbons, with a trophy for First Place. The top entries overall will be awarded the highly coveted and prestigious George Washington (male) and Betsy Ross (female) trophies. Remember, you must be registered in order to be eligible for judging and an award!

The circular drive area of the LRC will be reserved parking for Constables, Cy Creek VFD, Cy Creek EMS, etc. Please park in the large open lot near the pool gate area or in the curb cutout area across the street. Please do not park curbside in front of the LRC along Lakewood Forest Drive as the street will be much too full to allow for that. Overflow parking will be available at The Woods Private School parking lot and at the Lakewood Forest Mud parking across the gully from the clubhouse. Can't wait to see everyone there!



# HOA Architectural Guidelines & Community Standards

The purpose and intent of the Architectural Guidelines & Community Standards is to:

- Preserve the original architectural harmony and aesthetic qualities of the homes located in Lakewood Forest
- Provide guidelines to aid the homeowners when making exterior modifications or repairs
- Provide standards to aid the homeowner regarding the typical maintenance of lots and exterior of homes

Residents can assist in keeping costs down by adhering to the architectural guidelines & community standards along with documents governing the association by remedying minor violation infractions upon receipt of initial contact by HOA staff.

Architectural Guidelines & Community Standards

### FIREWORKS IN LAKEWOOD FOREST

Lakewood Forest does not take any enforcement action in regards to firework activity during holidays for the following reasons:

- -The subdivision is located in unincorporated Harris County in which fireworks are allowed unless a burn ban is in place. Our CCR's are subordinate to any local, state, or federal regulations.
- -The subdivision is comprised of (17) different sections with each section operating under a separate set of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions which do not mirror one another.
- -Enforcement action by the HOA is initiated in accordance with TX Property Code 209 and as such, Fund Representatives are not in a position to confront residents when they are outdoors engaging in firework festivities. Since unincorporated Harris County allows for fireworks, the Constables also have limited enforcement authority, however, they are willing to speak with residents who continue the use of fireworks into the early morning hours.
