In the biggest game of the CFB season so far, No. 4 Notre Dame upset No. 1 Clemson 47-40 in double-overtime as 5-point underdogs. ND's win ended Clemson's 36-game regular season win streak and extended ND's 23-game home win streak. The game generated 10.1 million viewers marking the 2nd most watched non-NFL sporting event of the year behind only Game 6 of the World Series.

Misleading Finals

Buffalo (-14.5) beat Northern Illinois 49-30. However, Northern Illinois had 26-14 first down and 397-357 yard edges. Northern Illinois was -3 in TO's. Buffalo scored 3 defensive TD's including 46 and 42-yard fumble returns and a 65-yard interception return.

Colorado St (+3) upset Wyoming 34-24. However, Wyoming had 23-18 first down and 465-342 yard edges but were -3 in TO's including a "Pick 6".

Maryland (+27.5) pulled off a stunner beating Penn St 35-19. However, Penn St had 30-16 first down and 434-405 yard edges but were -3 in TO's.

Oklahoma St (-14) held on to beat Kansas St 20-18. However, Kansas St had a 370-256 yard edge but were -2 in TO's. Kansas St settled for two short FG's in the first half and led 12-0 at halftime. Oklahoma St scored 20 unanswered capped off by an 85-yard fumble return TD with 6:32 left (at least a 10-point swing). Kansas St also failed on a 2-point conversion attempt with 2:08 left.

Northwestern (-4) beat Nebraska 21-13. However, Nebraska had 28-14 first down and 442-317 yard edges. The Huskers had 3 drives end inside Northwestern's 25-yard line in the second half with ZERO points.

Mississippi St (-18) beat Vanderbilt 24-17. However, in the **misleading final game of the week**, Vandy had 30-14 first down and 478-204 yard edges including 142(-22) on the ground. The Commodores were -5 in TO's and came up empty 5 times inside Miss St territory including an interception at the 3-yard line.

Wednesday, November 11th

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Central Michigan 32 NORTHERN ILLINOIS 24. Central Michigan is on a 5-1 SU (+11.7 ppg) and 6-0 ATS (+16 ppg) run vs Northern Illinois. The Chips come in off a 3-point win over Ohio last week. CMU had 24-16 first down and 427-345 yard edges but were also +2 in TO's. QB Daniel Richardson was 23 of 41 for 243 yards and a 1-0 ratio in his first start. Meanwhile, NIU is off a misleading 19-point loss to Buffalo. The Huskies had 26-14 first down and 397-357 yard edges. However, Northern Illinois was -3 in TO's. Buffalo scored 3 defensive TD's including 46 and 42-yard fumble returns and a 65-yard interception return.

BALL ST 33 Eastern Michigan 27. Ball St lost a heart-breaker last week as QB Plitt threw an interception in the final minute deep inside Ball St territory. Instead of setting up for a FG, Miami got a TD with :10 left for the 38-31 win. Meanwhile, Eastern Michigan is also off a close loss as they fell at Kent St 27-23. Kent St had 28-20 first down and 431-302 yard edges including 212-61 on the ground. Do note that EMU is on a 16-2-1 ATS (+7 ppg) run as a road underdog with 8 outright upsets. Ball St has not had much of a home field advantage as they are just 22-40-1 ATS (-4.3 ppg) at home since 2009. Lean EMU.

WESTERN MICHIGAN 31 Toledo 30. Toledo has won 8 of the last 10 meetings. Both teams come in off blowout wins over the two worst teams in the MAC. WMU crushed Akron 58-13 as WMU averaged 14.0 yards per pass while Akron averaged 3.1 yards per pass. Meanwhile, UT beat arch rival Bowling Green 38-3 and the Rockets had 25-15 first down and 524-267 yard edges including 310-139 on the ground. Still a lot to gather on each team. Slight leans on OVER and Toledo here.

Thursday, November 12th

BOISE ST 37 Colorado St 23. Boise is 9-0 SU (+20 ppg) and 6-3 ATS vs Colorado St. The Rams come in off a misleading 10-point win over Wyoming last week. Colorado St was outgained 465-342 but were +3 in TO's including a "Pick 6". QB Patrick O'Brien threw for 255 yards and 2 TD's. Meanwhile, Boise St was crushed by BYU at home 51-17. Boise St suffered its worst loss since the 1997 season opener to Cal State Northridge by 40 at home, the Broncos 2nd season as a FBS member! The Broncos have been without starting QB Hank Bachmeier for the past two weeks and were missing four other starters against BYU, including leading rusher George Holani and WR Octavius Evans. Then they lost backup QB Jack Sears early in the game. Seems like a good bounce back spot for Boise but too many injury unknowns.

Friday, November 13th

Florida Atlantic 25 FIU 16. Shula Bowl as FAU has easily won and covered 3 straight. FAU is 3-1 on the season and remarkably are only averaging 16 ppg on offense but are only allowing 12 ppg on defense. They've played quite a few games in adverse conditions including last week vs WKU. FAU backup QB Javion Posey, a redshirt freshman, replaced starter Nick Tronti and led a 12-play, 75-yard drive capped by a TD run that gave the Owls a 10-6 lead in the final minutes. On the other side, 0-3 FIU has had several games cancelled this year due to COVID. Their last game 3 weeks ago was ugly losing outright to FCS Jacksonville St. FIU was dominated much worse than the 19-10 final as Jacksonville St had 26-6 first down and 444-156 yard edges. The FAU defense is by far the best unit on the field.

Iowa 30 MINNESOTA 26. The Floyd of Rosedale Trophy has gone to Iowa in each of the last 5 years. Both teams were in similar spots last week at 0-2 and needing wins. Both teams delivered in big ways. We easily won on these pages with Iowa who crushed Michigan St 49-7. We were shocked that all the money came in against the Hawkeys as the line dropped from -7 to -5.5. All that money couldn't have been more wrong as we feel this Iowa team is underrated. On the other side, Minnesota is off a much-needed blowout win over Illinois. Minny RB Mohamed Ibrahim ran for 224 yards and 4 TD's but it should be noted that Illinois was down to a 4th string QB. While they just lost their last game as a road favorite, it's still worth noting that Iowa is on a 21-1 SU (+16.6 ppg) and 17-4-1 ATS (+10.0 ppg) run as a road favorite.

CINCINNATI 41 East Carolina 16. Cincy is on a 8-1 SU run in the series but last year had to rally for a 46-43 win as 3-TD favorites. The Bearcats are rolling as they have covered 3 straight games by an average of 26.5 ppg. Considering they have just played three of the better teams in the AAC in SMU, Memphis and Houston, there's a reason why they are now No. 7 in the polls and there is playoff talk. Still, this is a flat spot with a huge game at UCF on deck. On top of that, ECU QB Holton Ahlers has a 9-1 TD-to-INT ratio in his last 3 starts and the Pirates are perfectly capable of coming through the back-door. Lean ECU.

Saturday, November 14th

Memphis at Navy has been postponed due to COVID issues at Navy.

1★ **Arkansas (plus the points) FLORIDA 38 Arkansas 23.** Arkansas head coach Sam Pittman has tested positive for COVID and will not coach here. However, they are in good shape with DC and former Missouri head coach Barry Odom taking over as interim. Arkansas is 6-0 ATS and 3-3 SU after their 24-13 win over Tennessee last week. The Hogs trailed 13-0 at halftime but QB Felipe Franks got it going in the second half with 3 TD passes. Obviously, he will be playing with a chip on his shoulder here after being the starter at Florida for a couple of seasons. Speaking of the Gators, we easily cashed with Florida last week on these pages as they crushed Georgia after trailing 14-0 early. QB Kyle Trask has a great 22-3 TD-to-INT ratio on the season but he could be missing his outstanding TE Kyle Pitts here who took a devastating hit last week. We like Arkansas.

KENTUCKY 31 Vanderbilt 13. UK comes in off a bye and as of presstime it is unclear whether or not QB Terry Wilson can return for them. The Wildcats offense has really struggled the last two games with a combined 13 points. Meanwhile, in the **misleading final game of the week**, Vandy had 30-14 first down and 478-204 yard edges including 142-(-22) on the ground but lost by 7 at Mississippi St. The Commodores were -5 in TO's and came up empty 5 times inside Miss St territory including an interception at the 3-yard line. Our power ratings like Kentucky here but we're not thrilled laying 17 with a stodgy offense. **WEST VIRGINIA 25 TCU 22.** TCU is off back-to-back wins. Last week QB Max Duggan was only 11 of 23 for 73 yards and an INT but ran for 154 yards and 3 TD's. After five sacks combined in their first four games, TCU's defense has five in each of their last two games. On the other side, WV came up short twice deep in Texas territory not once, but twice in the 4Q in their 17-13 loss. Don't see too much value in this one as we think both our play-on teams down the stretch. **NC STATE 34 Florida St 24.** As of presstime, the status of FSU QB Jordan Travis is unknown. Travis was banged up last week in the loss to Pitt. The Noles are reeling at 2-5 and off back-to-back blowout losses. Meanwhile NC State has an extra day to prep after their 44-41 loss to Miami on Friday night. Note the Wolf Pack were outgained by more than 200 yards and despite their 4-3 record are -77 ypg on the season. We're passing until FSU's injury situation clears. **Texas A&M at Tennessee game has been postponed due to positive cases at A&M.**

2★ **Boston College (plus the points) Notre Dame 30 BOSTON COLLEGE 20.** After notching their first win over a No. 1 team in 27 years a double-overtime 47-40 thriller vs Clemson, this is an obvious let-down spot for Notre Dame. With that being said, the Irish have certainly impressed us in recent weeks. Last week they controlled the line of scrimmage vs Clemson with a 208-34 rushing yard edge and probably will control it here vs a BC team averaging only 107 rush ypg. However, this is BC's "Red Bandana" game where they honor BC alum Welles Crowther who was a 9/11 hero. The Eagles have played inspired and pulled off upsets over USC, Florida St and Miami in this Red Bandana game in the past. On top of it, they look to evoke memories of 1993 where they upset Notre Dame, the week after the Irish beat a No. 1 team. More pertinent to this year is we look for ND transfer QB Phil Jurkovec to play with a chip on his shoulder vs his former teammates and he should have success vs a ND pass defense that just gave up 439 yards last week. BC is on a 8-1-1 ATS run as a home dog and while our power ratings have this game right at the number, remember power ratings don't factor in the situation at all. We think the situation is worth a few points in this game.

NORTH CAROLINA 40 Wake Forest 27. Wake Forest comes in off a bye. Obviously, the demon Deacons are exceeding expectations so far this season with 4 straight wins. Meanwhile, the Tar Heels have been a bit of "Jekyll and Hyde" in recent weeks. Last week it was all good as they rolled Duke 56-24. North Carolina is +152 ypg on the season and are No. 11 in our power ratings, which may surprise some people. However, we think this line is right on the money. Pass.

GEORGIA SOUTHERN 32 Texas St 20. Texas St is a team that has played a nation-high 9 games already this season and have just got done playing physical BYU and the two best programs in the Sun Belt in UL-Lafayette and Appalachian St. They've allowed 256 rush ypg in those 3 games and now play the Georgia Southern option that averages 260 rush ypg. Last week Georgia Southern dominated Troy much worse than the 7-point final (+176 yards) and are playing their 3rd straight home game. We lean with GS here.

Pittsburgh 30 GEORGIA TECH 23. Pitt got QB Kenny Pickett back last week and proceeded to crush Florida St. While Pitt had a 358-290 yard edge, they were also +3 in TO's and they scored 3 TD's off those TO's. On the other side, Georgia Tech comes in off a much-needed bye after suffering 3 straight blowout losses. The Yellow Jackets are -98 ypg on the season while Pitt is +62 ypg even without Pickett for a few games. Slight lean on Pitt here.

Miami, FL 33 VIRGINIA TECH 32. After a solid start to the season despite being negatively impacted by COVID, Virginia Tech is now underachieving yet again under head coach Justin Fuente. Last week, the Hokies were outright upset as huge favorites to Liberty. An "icing the kicker" timeout back-fired in the worst way and it will be interesting to see how they respond. Miami has revenge for a upset loss to VT last year where they were -5 in TO's. Obviously, the Canes are much improved this season with better QB play. Last week D'Eriq King threw for 430 yards and 5 TD's while also running for 105 yards in the 44-41 win over NC State. Miami was missing 11 players, including starting left tackle John Campbell Jr. and starting tight end Brevin Jordan. If some of those guys return here, we like Miami.

CENTRAL FLORIDA 48 Temple 24. Both teams dealing with COVID, injuries and suspensions. As of press time it is unclear whether Temple QB Anthony Russo can return for the Owls. They've certainly missed him after back-to-back blowout losses. Meanwhile, UCF comes in off a bye but they still made news last week with four defensive starters removed from the team due to an off-field incident. This program isn't disciplined under head coach Heupel and we don't like where they're trending. We're passing until we get word on Russo.

Ohio St 49 MARYLAND 21. Ohio St is 6-0 SU vs Maryland with an average win by 36 ppg. The Buckeyes come in off a "flat" performance vs Rutgers last week. "Not to make excuses for our guys but one of the things that's real is you go up 35-3, (and) the stadium's empty," head coach Ryan Day said. "No juice in the stadium. It's something that we're going to really address this week and talk about." Meanwhile, Maryland has become the first team ever to pull back-to-back outright upsets as 18-plus point underdogs. Last week they covered the spread by 43.5 points as they beat Penn St 35-19 as 27.5-point dogs. However, after facing an overrated Minnesota team and a Penn St team that didn't have much to play for, we think they'll get a full 60 minutes from the Buckeyes here. This is our biggest power ratings disparity of the week. We think the market has upgraded the Terps too much in the last two weeks.

Wisconsin 26 MICHIGAN 24. Wisconsin is playing for the first time in 3 weeks after COVID shut their program down. At press time it is unknown whether or not QB Graham Mertz can return here after his sensational debut (20 of 21 passing). If not, Wisconsin could be down to a 4th string QB. Meanwhile, the Wolverines are 1-2 SU and off back-to-back embarrassing losses. First, it was losing outright as a 3-TD favorite to Michigan St and last week, they fell to Indiana for the first time since 1987. Nothing fluky about either game as they only rushed for 13 yards last week. This line is giving a lot of respect to Wisconsin who struggled at the line of scrimmage vs Illinois despite the lopsided final (3.4 to 5.2 yards per carry deficit).

Indiana 32 MICHIGAN ST 22. Michigan St is on a 10-1 SU (+18.3 ppg) and 8-3 ATS (+6.3 ppg) run in the series. However, Indiana is in the top 10 for the first time since 1969. The Hoosiers had already beat Penn St earlier this year and last week snapped a 24-game losing streak to Michigan. It wasn't fluky as Indiana had 28-17 first down and 460-357 yard edges including 118-13 on the ground. However, this is a sandwich spot here as they have a huge game vs Ohio St on deck. They're taking on a Michigan St team that was absolutely embarrassed last week losing 49-7 to Iowa as we easily cashed fading them on these pages. Note the Spartans are on a 2-14 ATS run at home (-10.3 ppg) and we think Indiana's flat spot is overly accounted for in this point spread.

Northwestern 27 PURDUE 24. Obviously, Northwestern has been very impressive so far this season at 3-0 SU. However, last week's win over Nebraska was misleading as Nebraska had 28-14 first down and 442-317 yard edges. The Huskers had 3 drives end inside Northwestern's 25-yard line in the second half with ZERO points. Meanwhile, Purdue is 2-0 but off a bye because their game was cancelled last week (Wisconsin COVID issues). All the money is on Northwestern so far this week and while we agree with it, there has been clear value lost.

RUTGERS 29 Illinois 25. This is the first time Rutgers has been a Big Ten favorite in 50 conference games dating back to 2014! Obviously, they are one of the most improved teams in the country this season under new coach Greg Schiano but it will be interesting to see how they handle expectations. Meanwhile, Illinois is 0-3 on the season and last week Illinois had 12 players out due to COVID-19 protocols and was down to fourth-string QB Coran Taylor. Starter Brandon Peters and backup Isaiah Washington were out, and third-string QB Matt Robinson remained unavailable after suffering a leg injury early in the Purdue game. Taylor wasn't great, going 6 of 17 through the air but suffered what appeared to be a hand injury on his throwing arm early in the second half. If he's less than 100% and if the other QB's remain out, Rutgers should take care of business.

MARSHALL 38 Middle Tennessee 17. Middle Tennessee has seen their last couple of games cancelled due to COVID issues among their opponents. The Blue Raiders are struggling this season at 2-5 but note they are on a 4-1 ATS run. Meanwhile, Marshall is dominating this season at 6-0 SU outscoring their opponents by 27 ppg and out-gaining them by 186 ypg. The Thundering Herd are allowing just 67 rush ypg! However, backing Marshall has become a bit expensive as they've failed to cover their last two games. We lean with MT.

HOUSTON 38 South Florida 23. Who would've guessed that a Dana Holgorsen led team is coming up short of expectation? The Cougars are 2-3 this season and have been blown out by the upper echelon teams they have played. Obviously, USF isn't one of those teams. However, last week the Bulls nearly pulled off a big upset over Memphis but they blew a 13-point lead late. We'd like Houston here as they take a major step down in competition but the banged-up Cougars were without play-making WR Marquez Stevenson and several others last week. Lean OVER.

ARIZONA ST 25 California 21. We were really impressed with what we saw from Arizona St last week. The Sun Devils are well-coached especially on defense with Marvin Lewis and Antonio Pierce leading the way. They should have beat USC if not for some fortunate breaks going the Trojans way down the stretch. They're taking on an experienced Cal team that is making their season debut after their game was cancelled last week vs Washington. Note teams that are playing their first game of the season vs teams that have already played this year are 25-12-2 ATS (+4 ppg).

Usc 40 ARIZONA 24. USC was very fortunate to get a win last week vs Arizona St scoring a couple of TD's in the final minutes. The Trojans haven't changed much even in this weird 2020 year. They're talented but undisciplined and several play calls could be questioned especially on offense. Meanwhile, they're taking on an Arizona team making their season debut. We haven't liked what we've seen from the Wildcats under Kevin Sumlin the last couple of years and this off-season saw several starters transfer out. We lean USC.

Air Force at Wyoming has been cancelled due to positive cases at Air Force. † Nevada 38 New Mexico 21. This game is being played at Sam Boyd Stadium (former home of UNLV) as the Lobos have been displaced to Las Vegas due to COVID. Last week, we were shocked by their performance at Hawaii as they jumped out to an early lead and easily covered even in defeat. However, QB Tevaka Tuioti (concussion) is out for this week's game and Trae Hall has been named the starter. On the other side, Nevada is a perfect 3-0 SU and 3-0 ATS on the season. QB Carson Strong has a 9-0 ratio and they have extra time to prep after crushing Utah St last Thursday. Early money has been all Nevada here but we don't see too much value.

Fresno St 32 UTAH ST 22. The big news here is Utah St firing head coach Gary Andersen 3 games into his second season in a COVID year. How bad was he that Utah St felt the need to make the change? Yes, the Aggies have been downright awful so far but we could actually see a bump from them this week with interim Frank Maile who was the interim in their 2018 bowl win over North Texas. On the other side, Fresno is off back-to-back wins and looks improved under first-year coach Kalen DeBoer. However, we don't see much value here.

APPALACHIAN ST 38 Georgia St 24. Appalachian St has started to look the part as of late with 4 straight blowout wins and the Mountaineers are +143 ypg on the season. They're averaging 283 rush ypg but are taking on a Georgia St defense that is allowing just 121 rush ypg. It is a bit of "Fool's Gold" as teams are having so much success through the air vs Georgia St averaging 350 ypg. Appalachian St does have a big game vs Coastal Carolina on deck and Georgia St's offense which averages 37 ppg is perfectly capable of coming through the back door.

Oregon 35 WASHINGTON ST 25. Washington St is on a remarkable 10-0 ATS run vs Oregon in the series covering by an average of 15.9 ppg. Most of that was under Mike Leach who is now at Miss St. Still, call us impressed with what the Cougars did last week at Oregon St winning outright much to our dismay on these pages. True frosh QB Jayden De Laura threw for 227 yards and RB Deon McIntosh (formerly at Notre Dame) ran for 147. Meanwhile, Oregon beat a short-handed Stanford team 35-14. We weren't that impressed as Stanford missed 4 FG's. QB Tyler Shough threw for 227 yards and ran for 85. We don't want to step in front of Wazzu's series streak but we do lean OVER.

WASHINGTON 31 Oregon St 20. Washington is the last team to make their 2020 season debut with this 11pm ET start time. The Huskies have a new coach in Jimmy Lake (former DC) but they are an inexperienced team especially on defense and also have to break in a new QB. Meanwhile, we weren't happy with Oregon St last week as they lost outright to Washington St dropping a play on these pages. Still, their offense did some nice things as QB Gebbia threw for 329 yards and RB Jefferson ran for 120 yards and 3 TD's. We lean Oregon St here.

SAN JOSE ST 38 Unlv 23. This game should have meaning for new UNLV head coach Marcus Arroyo who played QB at San Jose St and was an assistant coach there. These two teams have had disparate results so far as the Rebels are 0-3 SU and 0-3 ATS on the season while San Jose St is 3-0 SU and 3-0 ATS. Last week San Jose St pulled the big upset at San Diego St as QB Nick Starkel got hurt early but Nick Nash came in and threw for 169 yards and 2 TD's and also ran for 53 yards and a TD. This is the first time they are 3-0 since 1982. However, this is also the Spartans largest conference favorite role since they joined the Mountain West in 2013. We lean OVER as UNLV's has gotten better each game.

SAN DIEGO ST 30 Hawaii 21. San Diego St is 19-4-1 ATS (+11 ppg) in the series but has lost outright each of the last two years. This line seems expensive. San Diego St continues to be a bad favorite as they are now on a 2-8 ATS run laying doubles after getting outright upset to San Jose St last week. You can't lay a lot of points with an offense that struggles to score. Meanwhile, we were disappointed with Hawaii's performance last week but they did get the come-from-behind win vs New Mexico. Lean Hawaii.

1★ STANFORD 33 Colorado 23. A little inside-out handicap here. First, Colorado got an outright upset win over UCLA last week. However, note the Buffs were +4 in TO's and nearly blew a big lead. It was an emotional game for head coach Karl Dorrell who played and coached at UCLA. On the other side, Stanford played much better than the 35-14 final at Oregon last week. Despite playing without their starting QB Davis Mills and top playmaker WR Connor Weddington, they had 413 yards but missed 4 FG's! Mills and Weddington's statuses are unknown this week and we think this line could only go up if they get cleared. Let's also compare lines...last week UCLA was laying 6.5 on the road vs Colorado. This week Stanford is laying 6.5 at home to Colorado. Who is better UCLA or Stanford? We're guessing you'd pick Stanford like us. That screams line value.

UTSA 27 Utep 20. We faded UTSA on these pages last week but their game vs Rice was cancelled due to COVID issues for the Roadrunners. We thought they'd be tired playing a 9th straight game after playing several physical opponents in a row. Now they've had a week off. Speaking of weeks off UTEP has had several of them as of late. After playing 4 games in September, UTEP has played just two games in the last 6 weeks and didn't practice on Tuesday which could be a bad sign whether or not this game gets played. We'd lean with the Miners here but there are too many question marks at press time.

TEXAS TECH 31 Baylor 30. Baylor is not a good football team this year but they continue to compete and last week had a respectable 7-point loss at Iowa St. Meanwhile, the Red Raiders are also struggling and they will have a losing record in Big 12 play for the 11th season in a row. We would lean with Baylor here but last week they were without their top two RB's and they also lost LB Terrel Bernard to a shoulder injury (out for season).

Coastal Carolina 31 TROY 24. We love this Chanticleers team. Remember, we had them on these pages a couple of times early this season at Kansas and vs Arkansas St. However, we think Coastal Carolina is starting to get too expensive in the market place. After going 5-0 ATS vs FBS opponents with by far the No. 1 cover margin in the country, you either pushed or won fading them last week in their 17-point win over South Alabama. Now they're laying more than 10 on the road to a solid Troy team? Coastal QB McCall has an amazing 16-to-1 TD-to-INT ratio this season but we think the Chants could get caught looking ahead to Appalachian St next week. We like Troy.

Auburn at Mississippi St has been postponed due to positive cases at Miss St.

1★ TULANE 28 Army 20. The Green Wave are quietly playing their best ball of the season with 4 straight covers and back-to-back blowout wins. They're taking on an Army team that hasn't played the last couple of weeks. Yes, 6-1 Army has been impressive so far this season but who in the hell have they played? They've won 3 games against FCS opponents. They've also beat Middle Tennessee, ULM and UTSA who all rank No. 114 or worse in our current power ratings. Meanwhile, Tulane has close losses to Navy and SMU or they would be getting more love. Tulane knows how to run and defend the run as they outrushed Temple and ECU by a combined 449 yards the last two weeks and the Green Wave have won and covered 3 straight vs Army since 2015. We're riding the Wave here!

Penn St 30 NEBRASKA 27. Two teams in desperate need of a win. The 0-3 Nittany Lions suffered their biggest upset loss in school history last week losing to Maryland as a near 4-TD favorite. Penn St did have 30-16 first down and 434-405 yard edges but were -3 in TO's. They are going to split QB reps here between Sean Clifford and Will Levis. On the other side, Nebraska had 28-14 first down and 442-317 yard edges but lost at Northwestern. Nebraska had 3 drives end inside Northwestern's 25-yard line in the second half with ZERO points. The Huskers are already splitting their QB reps between Adrian Martinez and Luke McCaffrey. We don't see too much value here at the current numbers.

Smu 31 TULSA 30. Will be interesting to see if game experience matters later in the season. We know it doesn't matter early on (see trends) but we're guessing it's a negative that Tulsa has had their practice flow disrupted with multiple game cancellations this year. Meanwhile, SMU has played 8 games so far and has been in a routine. In Tulsa's last game we saw some of the worst officiating in recent CFB history as they were extremely fortunate to beat East Carolina as a big favorite. We don't think they'll be as fortunate here.

UAB 41 North Texas 24. Welcome back to the 2020 season North Texas who hasn't played since October 17th due to COVID issues on their team and their opponents as they have had multiple games cancelled. In case you forgot, they are all offense (39 ppg and 594 ypg) and no defense (allowing 44 ppg and 549 ypg). They're taking on a disappointing UAB team that is off back-to-back close losses. UAB should be anxious to regain their home dominance after seeing their 21-game home win streak snapped and they have the much better defense here.

UL-Monroe at Arkansas St has been postponed due to positive cases at ULM.
OLE MISS 40 South Carolina 30. All the money has come in on Ole Miss in this one as the Rebs come in fresh off a bye. They're also fading a South Carolina team that is off back-to-back blowout losses to LSU and Texas A&M.

The Gamecocks played without three defensive starters in DL Aaron Sterling and DBs Shilo Sanders and R.J. Roderick. That's not good news facing a Ole Miss offense averaging 38 ppg and 542 ypg. The problem is do you trust Ole Miss' defense to cover a double-digit point spread? It worked vs Vanderbilt (we cashed on these pages) but we're not anxious to do it again here.

UL-LAFAYETTE 34 South Alabama 20. ULL continues to get a lot of love in the market place. Yes, ULL is 6-1 SU but they are only +44 ypg and are 1-5 ATS since upsetting Iowa St in the opener. They're taking on a South Alabama team that is much improved this year and has close losses to Tulane and Georgia Southern while also giving Coastal Carolina a solid game last week. Lean USA.

Georgia at Missouri has been postponed due to positive cases at Missouri.
Rice 27 LOUISIANA TECH 26. Both teams saw their games cancelled last week. We really liked Rice against UTSA as the Owls are a much improved team this year and we cashed with them easily in their last game vs Southern Miss. Meanwhile, LT is off their best performance of the season, an upset over UAB. It should be noted though that the Bulldogs were out-rushed 338-49 in that game and are only averaging 60 rush ypg in their last 5 games. Lean Rice.

WESTERN KENTUCKY 27 Southern Miss 21. Hard to come up with a matchup involving more disappointing teams in 2020. Southern Miss is down to a 3rd string coach and possibly a 3rd string QB if Abraham and Whatley can't go like last week. The Golden Eagles are 1-6 ATS on the season. Meanwhile, WKU just picked up their first cover of the season last week in a 10-6 loss at FAU played in some nasty weather. Tough backing either team here but our ratings say WKU is the play.

Alabama at LSU has been postponed due to positive cases at Missouri.

VIRGINIA 33 Louisville 31. This game was supposed to be played last week. Classic "inside-out" handicap. Virginia upset North Carolina but NC had a 536-418 yard edge and averaged 15.8 yards per pass! Kudos for Mendenhall going for it late, they had no shot of stopping the NC offense. Meanwhile, the TO bug got Louisville again as the Cards had 23-21 first down and 548-466 yard edges but were -3 in TO's in a 7-point loss to Virginia Tech. About three hours before kickoff, Louisville announced nine players would be unavailable (COVID). That included leading solo tackler Monty Montgomery, starting free safety Isaiah Hayes and three of the Cardinals top four defensive ends - Yaya Diaby, Tabarius Peterson and Dayna Kinnaird. We're not sure who is all back this week and that prevents us from picking the outright upset here.

Utah 32 UCLA 26. This game has been rescheduled from Friday night. Utah makes their 2020 debut after last week's game vs Arizona was cancelled due to COVID issues at Utah. The Utes are one of the least experienced teams in the country and there is a lot of unknown with them other than head coach Kyle Whittingham who remains a staple. Meanwhile, Year 3 under Chip Kelly is off to a great start, or not as the Bruins were upset by Colorado last week. Colorado was +4 in TO's but also missed 3 FG's. UCLA QB Dorian Thompson-Robinson threw for 303 yards and 4 TD's while also running for 109 yards. We actually lean with Utah here.

LIBERTY 45 Western Carolina 12. Liberty comes in off the big upset over Virginia Tech last week thanks to an ill-advised timeout by the Hokies. It was arguably the biggest win in school history for the Flames. The problem is this is a huge flat spot with NC State on deck. Western Carolina is making their season debut after a 4-8 season a year ago. We could only look towards the dog here.

CHARLOTTE 45 Gardner-Webb 15. Gardner-Webb is making their 2020 debut here. They're taking on a Charlotte team that saw another one of their games cancelled last week. The 49ers need to rebound from a blowout loss to Duke in their last game especially with CUSA power Marshall on deck.

Week 11 Computer Projected Lines for Every CFB Game

For the past four seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game. **Games where there was of difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 302-252-12 (55%) clip the last three years.** That's pretty solid and actually better than our own handicapping in some seasons. **Last week's plays went 8-10 and now the record for this year is 37-29.** Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

Of the 8 games where our computer is off more than 3 points compared to the Vegas line (highlighted), our favorite team this week to back would be **Indiana -7.**

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

2. Eastern Michigan is on a 16-2-1 ATS (+7 ppg) run as a road underdog with 8 outright upsets. This week EMU is a 8.5-point underdog at Ball St.

HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Thursday, November 12th

TENNESSEE 24 Indianapolis 23. This game has huge implications in the AFC South. We think Tennessee is overrated as despite their 6-2 record, they are -10 ypg and last week were outgained by 147 yards but somehow won and covered vs Chicago. On the other side, even though all the money came in on Indianapolis, we got a nice winner fading them with the Ravens on these pages. However, we lean with the Colts here who have the stronger defense. The Colts +8 would also be a great first leg of a teaser heading into the weekend.

Sunday, November 15th

PITTSBURGH 29 Cincinnati 19. A lot of money coming in against the unbeaten Steelers here as it was announced yesterday that Big Ben was on the COVID-19 list. Apparently, he tested negative but it is due to contact tracing. Obviously, the Steelers survived what would have been one of the great upsets in NFL history last week outscoring the Cowboys in the 4Q 15-0 to move to 8-0 for the first time in franchise history. The Bengals are off a bye and are 6-1-1 ATS this season. Of course, their only non-cover came when we backed them vs Baltimore and that is the concern here. That was the Bengals only game this season against a Top 6-7 team in the NFL and they lost by 24. The Steelers have won 10 straight in the series by an average of 8.5 ppg. **We lean with them here provided Big Ben plays!**

DETROIT 26 Washington 22 Alex Smith looks like he will get the start here for the Football team. He threw for 325 yards last week but also 3 costly INT's in the loss to the Giants. That pretty much knocked them out of the NFC East race even though it's a dumpster fire of a division. Meanwhile QB Stafford looked gimpy last week for the Lions as he threw 2 INT's for the first time all year and Detroit was -3 in TO's in the loss at the Vikings. How does Patricia still have a job? We don't expect to be involved here.

CLEVELAND 26 Houston 23. Cleveland comes in off a bye and it looks like they could get back RB Nick Chubb, OL Wyatt Teller and TE Austin Hooper here. The bad news is that QB Baker Mayfield was on the COVID list due to contact tracing. The Browns' playoff hopes took a hit in their last game as they fell to the Raiders so this becomes a very important game for them. Meanwhile, Houston comes in off a less than impressive win over Jacksonville last week. Interim coach Romeo Crennel was the Browns head coach from 2005-2008. As long as Mayfield is cleared, we look for the Browns to get the win. Also note that 20-plus mph winds are in the forecast here.

GREEN BAY 31 Jacksonville 17. Jake Luton looks like he will get the start here for the Jags once again after he nearly orchestrated a comeback win vs Houston last week. They're facing a Green Bay team with extra rest coming off a blowout win at San Francisco last Thursday. There is no team worse in the NFL than Jacksonville when it comes to non-conference games as the Jags are on a 5-25 ATS (-7.8 ppg) run. We don't do often but lean with the big favorite here. You hear a lot of guys talk about never laying double-digits in the NFL. They're actually on a 61% run since 2015! Also note that 20-plus mph winds are in the forecast here.

2★ Philadelphia 26 N.Y. GIANTS 20. This is a horrible spot for the Giants playing a 10th straight week against a Philadelphia team coming off a bye. You have to give credit to the G-Men, they play hard and are on a 5-1 ATS run. But how much do they have left in the tank after playing 5 straight games decided by 3 points or less? The Eagles have owned the series going 21-4 SU (+6 ppg) the last 25 including 8 straight wins. They should be much healthier and could get back several starters here including LT Jason Peters, TE Dallas Goedert and WR Jalen Reagor. We like Philly.

Tampa Bay 27 CAROLINA 24. The Panthers did lose the first meeting by 14. Last week we cashed on these pages with Carolina in a 2-point loss at KC as QB Teddy Bridgewater continues to be a covering machine. Still, it looks like RB McCaffrey will be out here after he had 28 touches and 151 total yards. On the other side, Tampa Bay wasn't as fortunate as they were crushed on SNF. QB Tom Brady had one of the worst games of his entire career with 3 INT's. Either he's finally hitting the wall at 43 years old or he's due for a bounce back. We lean with the former.

LAS VEGAS 28 Denver 24. Las Vegas comes in off a fortunate win over the Chargers last week as they were outgained by 120 yards. Despite their 5-3 record, the Raiders are -14 ypg on the season. They're taking on a Denver team on back-to-back road trips after losing to the Falcons last week. At 3-5 the Broncos need this game if they have any remaining playoff hopes and Denver does have the better defense here. Also despite a much worse record Denver is a similar -24 ypg on the season. We lean with the Broncos.

ARIZONA 29 Buffalo 26. We lost last week on these pages with the Cardinals and we're still not over it 3 days later. The Cardinals had a 442-312 yard edge over the Dolphins and blew a 31-24 lead in the 4Q. They're taking on a Bills team that is feeling good about themselves after a big win over Seattle last week. QB Josh Allen threw for 415 yards and 3 TD's and the Bills are off to their best start since 1993. Do note that they were +4 TO's vs the Seahawks and we lean with the Cardinals here.

L.A. RAMS 29 Seattle 26. The Rams come in off a bye after a misleading loss vs the Dolphins two weeks ago where L.A. had a 471-145 yard edge but somehow lost. Meanwhile, the Seahawks have lost two of their last 3 games and last week fell at Buffalo mainly due to a -4 TO deficit. Seattle is overrated as they are -41 ypg on the season. Note they are 6-0 vs losing teams this year and 0-2 vs winning teams. We lean Rams but note Seattle at +7.5 makes a lot of sense if you're looking for some teasers this week.

NEW ORLEANS 30 San Francisco 21. The 49ers are a shell of their former selves suffering several injuries as many as 10 starters missed their last game. Last week could have been the straw that broke the Camel's back as they were crushed by Green Bay. However, it should be noted that a few of those 49ers players could be back for this one especially on the offensive side (not QB Jimmy G and TE Kittle who are both on IR). Meanwhile, the Saints have never looked better with 5 straight wins and on SNF humiliated Tampa Bay 38-3. They are now in prime position to win the NFC South (2-0 vs TB) and should also be focusing on the No. 1 seed. However, this isn't a good spot for them. We're passing for now.

Baltimore 25 NEW ENGLAND 19. We backed the Ravens last week on these pages and despite the fact a ton of money came in against them, they were a 14-point winner at the Colts although they were outgained 339-266. Meanwhile, the Pats are on a short week after their thrilling come-from-behind win over the Jets on MNF. Baltimore handed the 8-0 Pats a 17-point loss last year and New England has been good with revenge under Belichick. This is the first time since 2014 that New England is listed as a home underdog. That was 57 games ago! We don't see too much value here but the Ravens would be a good 2nd leg of a teaser at -1 or -1.5.

1★ L.A. Chargers 25 MIAMI 24. The Dolphins are so overrated. They are 5-3 but are -62 ypg on the season. They won a game vs the Rams getting outgained by 326 yards and last week beat us on these pages even though they were outgained by 130 yards. They have 4 non-offensive TD's in those games so it certainly hasn't been great QB play out of Tua. The defensive scores can't be sustainable. Meanwhile, the 2-6 SU Chargers are +62 ypg on the season. That's not a typo, they are PLUS-62 ypg while the Dolphins are MINUS-62 ypg. All 6 of the Chargers losses are by 7 points or less. We like Herbert more than Tua.

Monday, November 16th

1★ CHICAGO 23 Minnesota 21. We've been saying all year that the Bears are overrated. However, they had one of their better performances last week outgaining Tennessee 375-228 but somehow lost by 7 and failed to cover. We think their opponent Minnesota is getting a little too much love here. Yes, the Vikings have won and covered two straight after the bye. However, they are +4 TO's in those two games. RB Dalvin Cook has never looked better as he ran for 206 yards last week. However, the Bears have had the Vikings number the last 2 years winning four straight. It's also Kirk Cousins in a prime-time game (not good). We like the Bears.
